DOCTOR OF HUMANITIES. James B. Arnold, until his retirement, was production plant superintendent and in charge of all chemical semiplant, pilot plant, and development activities in the Latex-Organic Chemicals Department at The Dow Chemical Company. He joined Dow in 1934, after earning his Bachelor of Science Degree at Case Institute of Technology. At Dow he was instrumental in the development of latex, various herbicides and insecticides, and in the early processes for making monomers for plastics and synthetic rubber. He is president of the Strosacker Foundation, and a member of the Saginaw Valley State College Board of Fellows.

DOCTOR OF CIVIL LAW. Mrs. Audra E. Francis is Saginaw's "First Lady." She was the first woman to serve on the City Council, and was the first woman to chair the Saginaw County Board of Commissioners. The Audra E. Francis Recreation Center is named in her honor. She has served on the Saginaw County Mental Health Services Board, Saginaw Crippled Children's Society, Youth Protection Services, National Recreation Association, Red Cross, United Fund, Retarded Children's Association, Salvation Army's Eventide Home, Michigan Welfare League, Muscular Dystrophy, and the YWCA. She also served as international president of Zonta International.

DOCTOR OF HUMANITIES. Frank N. Andersen is owner and operator of Andersen's Sand and Gravel, Ready Mix Company, and Builder's Supply Company. He gave Andersen Pool to the City of Saginaw, and the Andersen Hall for Nurses to Saginaw General Hospital. He also donated 60 acres of land near Vassar for development of Andersen Park. He is a past president of the Chamber of Commerce, past president and director of Saginaw General Hospital, director of the Saginaw County United Way, life member of the Saginaw County 4-H Club Association. He was chairman of the \$1.4 million building fund campaign in 1950 for the YMCA, and served as chairman of the St. Mary's Hospital Nurses Home. He also has been a director of Michigan National Bank and Wickes Foundation. He is a member of the SVSC Board of Fellows.
