LANDEE AWARD RECIPIENT



DR. ROBERT W. MEADOWS Franc A. Landee Award for Excellence in Teaching Presented by Dr. Jack M. Ryder, President

Dr. Robert W. Meadows, Associate Professor of Education, is the 1978 recipient of SVSC's Franc A. Landee Award for Excellence in Teaching. Dr. Meadows came to SVSC in 1973 and had been a member of the College Curriculum Committee, chairman of the Department of Educational Foundations, vice president of the SVSC Faculty Association, and a member of the College Professional Practices Committee and Honors Committee.

Meadows received his Bachelor of Science and Master of Arts in Education degrees from Ball State University. He completed his Doctor of Education degree in educational administration there in 1969, with cognates in curriculum and teacher training. Prior to joining SVSC, he taught in various high schools, laboratory schools and at Indiana University, Ball State University and Wright State University.

He teaches courses in educational philosophy and social studies methods for elementary education and is a member of Phi Delta Kappa educational fraternity and the Association for Supervision and Curriculum Development. He has also been extremely involved in creative activities as well as speaking at 33 teacher and student seminars and workshops.

PAUL H. WENDLER Doctor of Laws



RALPH McCONNELL WILEY Doctor of Science

Paul H. Wendler has been an avid supporter and friend of Saginaw Valley State College since its inception in 1963. During the intervening years, he has played a major role in athletic fund raising for the College and has been chairman of two athletic fund drives. He has also served as an influential member of several college committees over the years.

Wendler's civic involvement has extended far beyond the College, with more than 14 years of service on the Saginaw City Council. He was mayor of the City of Saginaw for four years, during which time he spearheaded the planning and construction of the Saginaw Civic Center, and Wendler Arena was named in his honor.

Wendler is currently Director of Purchasing for Saginaw Steering Gear Division, General Motors Corporation, where he earlier was manager of plants one, five and six. He is highly principled, very disciplined and has a strong moral code. Throughout his involvement in numerous clubs and organizations including conservation, he has always tried to do his best, which has coincided with what was best. His ability to get along with people is unsurpassed, recardless of their level.

Ralph McConnell Wiley, the "Father of Saran", holds more than half of the early patents as author or co-author on both the product and process development of polymer science. During 44 years with Dow Chemical Company, he made an indelible impression and his research contributions are monumental.

Wiley's brilliant research career did much to pave the way for Dow in the successful development of business based upon the science of high polymers. So impressive was his work in his earlier years that he was named one of the company's first research scientists in 1955, and his success continued throughout his career because he never lost his zeal and enthusiasm for research.

Among his significant scientific accomplishments is the "Wiley Feeder," a device for accurate, continuous addition of color concentrate into a stream of plastic resin. He also developed the Wiley small scale impact test used to determine the toughness of plastic materials, as well as other test methods and concepts which resulted in 37 U.S. patents and countless publications in polymer chemistry journals.

DISTINGUISHED ALUMNI AWARD RECIPIENT



ROSELLA E. COLLAMER Third Distinguished Alumnus

Rosella E. Collamer (Class of '67), assistant professor of English at Saginaw Valley State College, will receive the third annual Distinguished Alumnus Award. Collamer, a published author, was also instrumental in establishing the Chrysallis Center at SVSC. This center is a unique college-community based counseling facility for mature individuals.

Having earned a degree with majors in Psychology and English at SVSC, Collamer received her Master of Arts degree from Central Michigan University where she concentrated on English. Collamer has served as vice-chairman of the Midland Adult Education Advisory Council Executive Board, Editor of the Chrysallis Journal and a member of the development committee of the Women's Resource Center of Saginaw.

She was a founder of the Michigan Women's Studies Association and also has been active in the Student Services Division of the National University Extension Association. Next year she will serve as its secretary.

In October, 1975, she was named "one of the outstanding women in higher education" by the Michigan Trial Lawyers Association.

Collamer and her family reside in Midland, Michigan.

GRADUATION ATTIRE

Following a code adopted by the Intercollegiate Commission in New York City in 1895 and used by more American Colleges and universities, our graduates today are wearing gowns made of black material. Sleeves on the gowns of bachelor's degree recipients are long and pointed, while master's degree gowns have long sleeves which are closed at the bottom.

Hoods, made of the same acetate material as the gown, are lined in cardinal red with the second school color — blue — indicated by the chevron. In addition, the colored velvet or velveteen edging on the hood designates the department or faculty from which the degree was issued.

THE INSIGNIA OF SAGINAW VALLEY STATE COLLEGE

The geographical area formed by Bay City, Midland and Saginaw, popularly known as "The Golden Triangle," is represented by the triangle within the Saginaw Valley State College seal. This depicts the merging of three separate urban communities, with a combined population of more than 400,000, into the metropolitan Saginaw Valley.

The three symbols within the seal are of Egyptian origin. The figure at the top stands for live or living, denoting the fact that education is an ongoing, life long process and has a value which lasts forever.

The symbol at the lower left represents light perhaps the inner light. It recognizes that "our knowledge is a torch of smokey pine that lights the pathway but one step ahead." Standing opposite this light of knowledge in the lower right corner is a staff, which stands for strength. This may be regarded as an appeal for the endurance necessary to search for and find the truth, and the strength to speak and live it.
