CANDIDATES FOR HONORARY DEGREES



DR. RICHARD D. MUDD DOCTOR OF HUMANITIES

Dr. Richard D. Mudd was born in Washington, D.C., on January 24, 1901. He holds A.B., M.A., Ph.D. and M.D. degrees from Georgetown University. He interned and completed a residency at Henry Ford Hospital. Locally, Dr. Mudd has served on the consulting staffs of Saginaw Community Hospital, Saginaw General Hospital, and St. Mary's Hospital, and he is an honorary staff member of St. Luke's Hospital. He served as medical director in various divisions of General Motors, including Chevrolet-Saginaw Foundries. Numerous medical association memberships and medical publications have complemented his career.

For over 60 years, Dr. Mudd worked to clear the name of his grandfather, Dr. Samuel Mudd, the physician who set the broken leg of assassin John Wilkes Booth. Dr. Mudd owns one of the most complete collections of books and other factual data concerning the Lincoln assassination. He is affiliated with a number of historical societies, including the Saginaw County Historical Society and the Saginaw Genealogical Society. He is a former president and vice president of the historical society, and a charter member and founder of the genealogical society.

His military service extends from 1926 to 1961. He was a reserve officer in the U.S. Army and later the Air Force, with five years active duty in World War II and one year in the Korean conflict. He received the Legion of Merit for his service in World War II.

A member of the Catholic Church, Dr. Mudd belongs to St. Mary's Cathedral parish. He is a member of the Holy Name Society, Knights of Columbus, National Catholic Social Action Conference, the Sovereign Order of St. John of Jerusalem, and the Sovereign Order of St. George.

Honors conferred upon Dr. Mudd include a D.A.R. Medal of Honor presented in 1974. In 1959 Georgetown University recognized him as one of six outstanding graduates. He received thirteen citations for his military medical accomplishments, and was the recipient of an Air Force Commendation Ribbon. He was awarded a Certificate of Recognition by the National Council of Catholic Men. Dr. Mudd's life achievements have been recognized in numerous biographical reference publications, and he is a published author.

Dr. Mudd and his wife, Rose, are the parents of seven children. His daughter, Rose Marie Nickodemus, has been a mathematics instructor at SVSC for several years, and is basic skills mathematics coordinator for the college. A son, Thomas B. Mudd, taught American history here and earned a minor in data processing from SVSC in 1983. Another daughter, Stella K. Crowe, received a B.S. in data processing and is a member of SVSC's adjunct faculty. Her husband, Robert, will receive a B.A. in art from SVSC this spring. The Crowe's daughter, a senior at Nouvel High School, is taking an astronomy course at the college, and Dr. Mudd has lectured here several times on Lincoln assassination topics.

RICHARD V. WOLOHAN DOCTOR OF LAWS

Richard V. Wolohan was born in Birch Run on October 9, 1915, the youngest of nine children, and was educated in public and parochial schools there. Growing up during Depression years, Wolohan faced limited opportunities for higher education. Because he felt educational preparation was vital to career success, he saved enough from his part-time earnings in high school to pay tuition for a 10 week course at Saginaw Business Institute. Later he worked without pay for a Saginaw public accounting firm to further his education.

During his youth, he did farm work. He began working in a local grocery store while in high school. After his junior year in high school, he was employed summers and afternoons in a hardware store. In 1932 he joined the family grain, bean, feed and lumber business, performing manual and clerical work for 10 cents per hour.

In 1944, following a short stint in the U.S. Army, Wolohan became manager of a Davison elevator purchased by the family firm. He used the opportunity to add a lumber division to the Davison business and restore the operation to financial soundness.

Because of his success with the Davison firm, Wickes Corporation invited Wolohan to join their Saginaw headquarters. He served there as vice president and general manager of Wickes Lumber Division.

In 1964, Wolohan was the principal founder in establishing Wolohan Lumber Co., which had 1984 sales of approximately \$140 million from 34 stores in seven states. He currently serves as chairman of the board for the firm.

Wolohan has served as director or trustee for numerous public and not-for-profit corporations, including the City Rescue Mission. He has completed numerous committee assignments for St. Mary's Hospital and for St. Stephen's Church. He is a director of the Profit Sharing Council of America, trustee of the Profit Sharing Research Foundation, and of Serra International Trust Fund.

He is a member of the Saginaw Club and Saginaw Country Club. He and his wife, Angela, are the parents of seven children.



MARGARET RORKE
DOCTOR OF LETTERS

Margaret Rorke is a native of Saginaw. After earning B.A. and J.D. degrees from the University of Michigan, she became the first woman to be admitted to the Saginaw County Bar. She also has been admitted to practice before the United States Supreme Court and belongs to the Michigan State Bar Association.

For twenty-two years her verse appeared regularly on the editorial pages of the *Saginaw News*. During the past several years, her work has frequently headed the columns of Judd Arnett in the *Detroit Free Press*. Her poems also have been printed in *Better Homes and Gardens*, the *P.E.O. Record*, *Guideposts*, and other magazines. In the spring of 1981, Rorke was featured as *Ideals'* "Best-Loved Poet."

Her poems also appear in numerous anthologies. Her first collection of verse, *My Ego Trip*, was published in 1976. A second collection of her verse, *An Old Cracked Cup*, was published in 1980. Her latest book is titled *Christmas Could-Be Tales (and Other Verses)*.

In 1946 she married William C. Rorke. Her son, Robert C. Rorke, resides in Saginaw, and her daughter, Margaret, lives in Salt Lake City, Utah.

Mrs. Rorke is a member of the First Congregational Church, P.E.O. Sisterhood, Alpha Chi Omega, Saginaw Culture Club, and Woman's national Farm and Garden Association. She served two terms as president of the Saginaw chapter of Zonta International.



REP. J. ROBERT TRAXLER
DOCTOR OF LAWS

J. Robert Traxler represents the 8th U.S. Congressional District. Elected to the U.S. House of Representatives in 1974 in a special election, Traxler became the first Democrat in forty-two years to hold the seat. He currently is serving his fifth term as 8th District Representative.

Born in Kawkawlin on July 21, 1931, Traxler grew up in Bay City. He received a B.A. degree in political science from Michigan State University and an L.L.B. degree from the Detroit College of Law. Immediately after earning his law degree, Traxler served as Assistant Bay County Prosecutor for two years.

Traxler was elected to the Michigan legislature in 1962 and served 12 years there. His assignments included House Majority Floor Leader and chairman of the House Judiciary Committee. His service in the Michigan legislature earned Traxler citations of honor from such groups as the Michigan Medical Society, the Michigan Agricultural Conference, the Fraternal Order of Police, Michigan Probate Judges, and the Prosecuting Attorney Association in Michigan. He was named the "Most Effective House Member" by the Capitol Press Corps in Lansing.

In the U.S. Congress, Traxler is a member of the House Appropriations Committee and the ranking majority member of both the HUD Independent Agencies and the Agriculture subcommittees.

Traxler's legislative efforts include a series of bills to aid the elderly living on fixed incomes, prevention of railroad abandonment, dredging of Michigan's waterways and harbors, rural and economic development initiatives, restoration of unemployment and Social Security benefits, and the solution of farm credit problems.

THE 1984-85 FRANC A. LANDEE AWARD FOR EXCELLENCE IN TEACHING



JOHN A. CLINKENBEARD PROFESSOR OF ACCOUNTING

John A. Clinkenbeard, professor of accounting, joined the Saginaw Valley State College faculty in 1969. He played an active role in the development of SVSC's business and management program to the status of an academic school. He has served as chair of the accounting department, and has taught accounting at all undergraduate levels.

Clinkenbeard said he came to SVSC because the possibility of starting a school which had no previous history or tradition was a very exciting prospect. He indicated that he has not been disappointed. He feels that SVSC's School of Business and Management is strong, and that its accomplishments are very worthwhile.

Prior to his post at SVSC, Clinkenbeard taught at Syracuse University, Western Reserve University in Cleveland, and Earlham College in Indiana. He holds M.B.A. and A.B. degrees from the University of Chicago.

His professional memberships include the American Accounting Association and the National Association of Accountants. He is a member of Beta Alpha Psi and Beta Gamma Sigma business and accounting honorary societies. In 1951-52 he was named an A.G. Becker Fellow by the University of Chicago.

Professor Clinkenbeard and his wife, Ellen, reside in Midland. They are the parents of three daughters.



SUSIE B. EMOND ASSOCIATE PROFESSOR OF EDUCATION

Dr. Susie B. Emond began teaching at Saginaw Valley State College in 1978. Her first career, however, was as an elementary school teacher. She taught seven and eight year old children at the University of Florida laboratory school from 1972 to 1977. Prior to that, she held various elementary school teaching positions.

She began teaching at the college level to try to make a difference to more children in the classroom. She believes helping children become successful readers is important to teachers and parents alike. Her guiding philosophy in working with graduate and undergraduate education majors is to give them methodology of developmental reading and practical applications that will work in the classroom.

After earning bachelor of science and master of science degrees from Indiana State University, Emond completed an Ed.D. in curriculum instruction with a major in reading at the University of Florida. She has concentrated on reading development of elementary school children, and has presented numerous papers and speeches on the topic. She currently serves as president of the Saginaw Area Reading Council.

Emond's professional memberships include the International Reading Association, the Michigan Reading Association, the Association for Supervision and Curriculum Development, Michigan Education Association and the National Education Association. She is a member of Phi Delta Kappa.

She is married to John Emond. The couple and their two children reside in Saginaw Township.

1985 DISTINGUISHED ALUMNI AWARD



B. J. HUMPHREYS

B. J. Humphreys graduated from Saginaw Valley State College in 1977 with a Bachelor of Arts in history. Prior to that, he earned a Juris Doctorate degree from the Detroit College of Law.

In 1957 he began practice with Lamson & Humphreys, and was a partner in Lamson Humphreys, P.C., of Saginaw prior to its merger with Smith & Brooker, P.C. He presently is a senior member of Smith & Brooker, which has offices in Bay City, Saginaw, Flint and Bloomfield Hills. Humphreys' practice deals with business, finance, real property, trusts and public institution law. He represents several area school districts.

In 1982 Detroit College of Law awarded an honorary Doctor of Laws degree to recognize Humphreys for his contributions to the legal profession and the field of legal education.

He serves on the school's board of trustees and is a charter member of the DCL president's club. He also is vice president of DCL.

Humphreys has served on SVSC's Annual Fund Committee since its inception in 1977. In 1980 he was elected to the board of the SVSC Foundation and has been its chairman since 1983.

He holds membership in numerous business and civic organizations in the Saginaw Valley, and is presently a member of the executive board of the United Way of Saginaw County. His community memberships have included the Saginaw County Historical Society, Saginaw Kiwanis Club, Saginaw Junior Chamber of Commerce, building committee of Saginaw YWCA, and Legal Services of Saginaw. He also serves as an officer of trustees for several private foundations.

Humphreys and his wife, Laura, reside at 4560 Ashland Drive, Saginaw.

ACADEMIC REGALIA

Academic regalia of robe and hood are believed to have had their beginnings at the English Universities of Oxford and Cambridge during the twelfth and thirteenth centuries. The hoods are a carry over from the times when the monks, who operated the universities, wore them to protect their shaved heads in winter or to collect alms when worn as shoulder capes.

Use of the academic robe came to the United States in 1754 with the founding of what is now Columbia University. In 1895 a commission of university officials adopted a universal code of design and color for academic garb which has undergone various revisions, the latest in 1960. Styling of robes varies for the bachelor's, master's, and doctoral degrees and the width of border and length of hood increase with the type of degree. The color of the velvet border of the hood indicates the field of study, while the lining designates the colors of the institution granting the degree. In the case of Saginaw Valley State College, the colors are red and royal blue.

The mace carried by the marshal in the academic processional symbolizes authority.

THE INSIGNIA OF SAGINAW VALLEY STATE COLLEGE

The geographical area formed by Bay City, Midland and Saginaw is represented by the triangle within the Saginaw Valley State College seal. This depicts the merging of three separate urban communities, with a combined population of more than 400,000, into the metropolitan Saginaw Valley.

The three symbols within the seal are of Egyptian origin. The figure at the top stands for life or living, denoting the fact that education is an ongoing, life-long process and has a value that lasts forever.

The symbol at the lower left represents light — perhaps the inner light. It recognizes that “our knowledge is a torch of smokey pine that lights the pathway but one step ahead.” Standing opposite this light of knowledge in the lower right corner is a staff, which stands for strength. This may be regarded as an appeal for the endurance necessary to search for and find the truth, and the strength to speak and live it.

The year of the College's founding, 1963, appears below the triangle.
