CANDIDATE FOR HONORARY DEGREE



RICHARD H. GILMORE DOCTOR OF LAWS

Richard H. Gilmore, a retired orthodontist, served with dedication and commitment on SVSU's Board of Control from 1971 through September 1988. He chaired the board in 1986 and 1987 and also served as vice chairman in 1985.

Born in Allentown, Pennsylvania, Dr. Gilmore graduated from the University of Pittsburgh Dental School. After serving with the U.S. Army Dental Corps, he conducted private practice dentistry in New Castle, Pennsylvania from 1946 to 1949. In 1951 he received a master of science in orthodontics from the University of Michigan. That same year Dr. Gilmore moved his practice to Saginaw, which marked the beginning of a successful 30-year career in orthodontics.

His direct involvement with SVSU began as a member of the Board of Fellows in 1968, where he served until 1971. In 1988 he again was named to membership on this advisory board. Dr. Gilmore and his wife, Alma, together are noted for their varied and significant involvement in University projects. Dr. Gilmore promoted Saginaw Valley Dental Society support for scholarships at SVSU. He has served for 12 years on the SVSU Foundation board of directors, assisting with various fund raising efforts for the University. The Gilmores played an active role in the successful campaign to secure private funds for the Dorothy (Honey) and Ned S. Arbury Fine Arts Center, and donated a bronze, titled "Persephone," for the Marshall M. Fredericks Sculpture Gallery and Garden that is part of the Center.

Dr. Gilmore is a former president of both the Saginaw Valley District Dental Society and the Saginaw County Dental Society. Other professional memberships include the Michigan Dental Service Corp., the Michigan Dental Association, the American Dental Association, the Great Lakes Society of Orthodontists and the American Association of Orthodontists. He was selected as a "Fellow" in the American College of Dentists in 1972 and served on the board of directors of Delta Dental Plans of Michigan from 1959 to 1969.

Always active in community endeavors, Dr. Gilmore's past and current organizational memberships include Optimists Club, Saginaw JayCees, Saginaw Rotary Club, Saginaw Club, Germania Club, the Masonic Lodge, Saginaw Art Museum, Saginaw Valley Torch Club and Saginaw Y.M.C.A. In 1987 he was named a Paul Harris Fellow by Saginaw Rotary Club. He is a member of the Saginaw General Hospital Cleft Palate Clinic. His interest has extended to the political arena and includes leadership in local Republican Party affairs. He chaired the regional meeting of the Michigan Association of the Professions to organize a campaign supporting passage of the proposed Constitutional Convention in 1963. He is listed in "Who's Who in the Midwest."

The Gilmores married in 1946 and have one son and two grandchildren.

THE 1988-89 FRANC A. LANDEE AWARD FOR EXCELLENCE IN TEACHING



ENAYAT H. MAHAJERIN ASSOCIATE PROFESSOR OF MECHANICAL ENGINEERING

Enayat H. Mahajerin, recipient of the 1988-89 Franc A. Landee Award for Excellence in Teaching, began his teaching assignments with Saginaw Valley State University in 1984. Prior to his arrival at SVSU, he was an instructor and assistant professor in the Department of Metallurgy, Mechanics and Material Science at Michigan State University.

Dr. Mahajerin is a native of Iran but a permanent resident of the United States. He received a bachelor of science degree in machine design from the College of Science and Technology in Tehran, Iran. He was awarded a master of science in metallurgy by Michigan State University in 1977 and was a teaching and research assistant there while completing requirements for a Ph.D. in engineering mechanics.

In 1981 Dr. Mahajerin received the Outstanding Academic Achievement Award from MSU's College of Engineering. He attained the highest academic standing of his graduating class of engineering in the College of Science and Technology, Tehran, Iran. He is a member of the American Society of Mechanical Engineers.

At SVSU Dr. Mahajerin teaches statics, dynamics, strength of materials, machine design, engineering materials, physical metallurgy, welding experimental solid mechanics, metallurgy and heat treatment, computer aided design, computer graphics and applied calculus. His research interests are structural analysis, composite materials, applied mathematics and computer modeling. He has numerous publications to his credit, dealing with various aspects of mechanical engineering and computer applications.

Dr. Mahajerin and his wife, Tahera, reside in Saginaw. They have three children.

THE 1988-89 EARL L. WARRICK AWARD FOR EXCELLENCE IN RESEARCH



HONG YOUL PARK PROFESSOR OF ECONOMICS

Dr. Hong Y. Park joined SVSU as an assistant professor of economics in 1975. He advanced to associate professor in 1979 and has held the rank of full professor since 1984. A native of Korea, Dr. Park earned his undergraduate degree in economics from Kyung Hee University in Seoul and a master of arts from Seoul National University. He completed an M.B.A., with a major in quantitative analysis, at Fairleigh Dickinson University, New Jersey, and a Ph.D. in economics at Utah State University.

Dr. Park specializes in economic theory, economic development and regional and resource economics. He initiated and is editor of the *SVSU Economic and Business Review* and he directs the SVSU Center for Economic and Business Research. In addition to business and economic topics available in the *Review*, Dr. Park has published the results of several special studies conducted by the Center. Included are reports analyzing and profiling bankruptcies in northeastern Michigan, a recent 20-year history of structural changes in the Saginaw, Bay, Midland and Genesee counties' industrial base, and a wage and benefit survey of the tri-county region. He has numerous other publications to his credit and frequently presents papers at professional conferences and seminars, many of them international in scope. He frequently addresses local groups on economic topics. In 1981-82 he returned to Kyung Hee University as a visiting professor.

In support of his research, Dr. Park has garnered several grants, including SVSU Faculty Research Growth grants and awards from various external sources. Among his professional memberships are the American Economic Association, the Econometric Society, Regional Science Association, Southern Regional Science Association, Western Economic Association and Mid-Continent Regional Science Association.

Dr. Park and his wife, Chung Soo, reside in Saginaw and are the parents of four children.

ANDREA R. WILLIS

Andrea R. Willis received a Master of Arts in Teaching degree through SVSU's Macomb County program in 1977. She is the first graduate of an off-campus program to receive the Alumni Association's highest honor. Her undergraduate work was completed at Eastern Michigan University. Presently she is a third grade teacher at Holden Elementary School in the Warren Consolidated School District.

In addition to 24 years' teaching experience, Ms. Willis has participated in numerous inservice training programs. She was the recipient of the "Regional Invent America! Special Educator Award" in 1987. Recently she was named Michigan's Teacher of the Year for 1988-89. She credits support from her parents and grandparents, plus contact with "master teachers" while she was a student, with nurturing her interest in teaching.

Ms. Willis holds numerous professional memberships, including the Warren Education Association, Michigan Education Association, National Education Association, the Michigan Council for the Social Studies, the Macomb County Association for the Academically Talented, Inc. and the Michigan Association of Educators for the Gifted, Talented and Creative.

In her spare time, Ms. Willis enjoys directing and appearing in local theatrical productions. Among her theater credits are producing and directing the Sterling Heights High School production of "Bye, Bye Birdie" and co-direction of Warren High School and Cousino High School joint production of "The Boyfriend." She also has directed numerous children's theater productions and participated in several community theater productions.

Ms. Willis represents the 14th person to receive the Distinguished Alumni Award, which is based on service to the community, the University and the SVSU Alumni Association.

Ms. Willis resides in Rochester, Michigan, and has a 22-year old son.

ACADEMIC REGALIA

Academic regalia of robe and hood are believed to have had their beginnings at the English Universities of Oxford and Cambridge during the twelfth and thirteenth centuries. The hoods are a carry-over from the times when the monks, who operated the universities, wore them to protect their shaved heads in winter or to collect alms when worn as shoulder capes.

Use of the academic robe came to the United States in 1754 with the founding of what is now Columbia University. In 1895 a commission of university officials adopted a universal code of design and color for academic garb that has undergone various revisions, the latest in 1960. Styling of robes varies for the bachelor's, master's and doctoral degrees, and the width of border and length of hood increase with the type of degree. The color of the velvet border of the hood indicates the field of study, while the lining designates the colors of the institution granting the degree. In the case of Saginaw Valley State University, the colors are cardinal red and royal blue.

The mace carried by the marshal in the academic processional symbolizes authority. This mace survived the 1985 Saginaw Valley State College fire.

THE INSIGNIA OF SAGINAW VALLEY STATE UNIVERSITY

The geographical area formed by Bay City, Midland and Saginaw is represented by the triangle within the Saginaw Valley State University seal. This depicts the merging of three separate urban communities, with a combined population of more than 400,000, into the metropolitan Saginaw Valley.

The three symbols within the seal are of Egyptian origin. The figure at the top stands for life or living, denoting the fact that education is an ongoing, life-long process and has a value that lasts forever.

The symbol at the lower left represents light — perhaps the inner light. It recognizes that “our knowledge is a torch of smokey pine that lights the pathway but one step ahead.” Standing opposite this light of knowledge in the lower right corner is a staff, which stands for strength. This may be regarded as an appeal for the endurance necessary to search for and find the truth, and the strength to speak and live it.

The year of the University’s founding, 1963, appears below the triangle.



Saginaw Valley State University was founded in 1963 as a private institution to meet higher education needs in east-central Michigan. In 1965, Saginaw Valley College (SVC) became state-assisted. In 1975 the name was changed to Saginaw Valley State College (SVSC) and, in 1987, the institution achieved university status (SVSU).

There were just 119 students when classes began in 1964, but strong academic programs, reasonable costs and a variety of extra-curricular activities attracted growing numbers of students. Today, nearly 6,000 people from Michigan, several other states, and 16 nations are enrolled in more than 60 programs of study leading to bachelor’s and master’s degrees. International exchange and guest professors and students and an active international program bring the added dimension of other cultures to SVSU.

The primary mission of the University is to promote the intellectual and personal growth of students. A highly qualified faculty, most of whom hold terminal degrees, teach in both day and evening classes. The average class size is under 25 students, so instructors can give personal attention to individual needs. As an important part of its mission, SVSU fosters research and creative activities. The goals of the research program are to extend knowledge, inspire superior teaching, and contribute to the intellectual, social and economic well-being of the region.

Community service is another element of the University mission. SVSU sponsors continuing education courses, conferences, workshops, entrepreneurship and technology transfer efforts. Cultural events, many campus activities and the library are open to the public.

The University has a 782-acre campus located on M-84 (Bay Road) within the triangle formed by Bay City, Saginaw and Midland. Excellent transportation routes (I-75 access within three miles) connect the rural campus with urban centers.

SVSU is one of the most modern centers for higher education in the state. Recently completed construction projects totaling over \$60 million complement facilities built between 1966 and 1978 to provide an attractive, barrier-free campus. *The Science Building* and *Maurice E. Brown Hall* opened for 1986 fall semester classes. The *Melvin J. Zahnnow Library* opened early in 1987, and the *Dorothy (Honey) and Ned S. Arbury Fine Arts Center* and *Marshall M. Fredericks Sculpture Gallery* later that year. Other facilities include *Pine Grove Apartments*, a 40-unit student housing complex, and the *Administrative Services Building*. The *Jack M. Ryder Health and Physical Education Center* is expected to be completed in time for 1989 fall semester classes.

While these added facilities are important assets in meeting the University’s mission, the essence of a university is not bricks and mortar, but the people who teach and learn within a building’s walls. The employment and retention of highly qualified professionals to its teaching faculty and support staff is a primary goal of the University.

The physical facilities, coupled with the commitment of SVSU personnel to serve the needs of the Saginaw Valley region, promise a bright future for the University and the people it serves.
