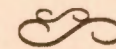

THE COMMENCEMENT SPEAKER

DR. DREW E. HINDERER PROFESSOR OF PHILOSOPHY



Drew E. Hinderer, professor of philosophy, has been on the SVSU faculty since 1980. Prior to his appointment at SVSU he was an assistant professor of philosophy for the University of Wisconsin Center System.

Dr. Hinderer earned his A.B. from Hope College and was awarded his Ph.D. by the University of Michigan. He also participated in a special Balkan Studies Seminar during the summer of 1969, under the auspices of the Great Lakes Colleges Association and the

University of Novi Sad, Novi Sad Yugoslavia, where he did research in contemporary Marxism, and Musicology and Composition. In 1977 Hinderer attended the Internationale Sommerakademie der Hochschule "Mozarteum" in Salzburg as a student of Rudolf Klepac.

Dr. Hinderer's areas of special academic interest include applied ethics, Asian philosophy, philosophy of religion and ancient philosophy. A prolific writer, Dr. Hinderer has nearly 40 articles and papers to his credit. Among the three books he has published are *Building Arguments: An Informal Logic*, a 245-page textbook that informally introduces logic and reasoning; *Moral Deliberation* and *Ethical Issues in Organ Transplantation*, two medical ethics manuals for use in regional hospital ethics committees.

Dr. Hinderer is a recipient of the 1991 SVSU Faculty Association Award for Scholarly Achievement. He was a visiting professor of philosophy at Hope College (MI) in 1989, and in 1986 Dr. Hinderer received a fellowship from Columbia University and the National Endowment for the Humanities Workshop on Asian Studies. He received another fellowship from the National Endowment for the Humanities Institute for the Teaching of Medieval Civilization in 1983. He received a pair of research grants while working for the University of Wisconsin Center System from 1975 through 1980 and three more during his post-graduate days at the University of Michigan.

Dr. Hinderer applies his background in music in live performances as a member of the SVSU Valley Wind Quintet. The bassoon is Dr. Hinderer's instrument of choice. The Quintet is performing at today's Commencement ceremony.

Dr. Hinderer is a Midland resident.

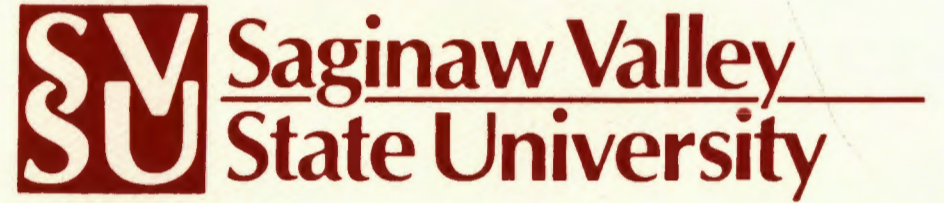
