# THE 1994-95 LANDEE TEACHING EXCELLENCE AWARD



DR. STEPHEN S. LAWRENCE
ASSISTANT PROFESSOR OF CHEMISTRY

Dr. Stephen S. Lawrence has been a member of the SVSU faculty since 1992. He holds a Bachelor of Arts degree in chemistry from the University of Missouri-St. Louis where in 1989 he also earned a Ph.D. in analytical/physical chemistry.

Dr. Lawrence is the principal designer of SVSU's innovative Chemistry Degree Option in Environmental Chemistry. He serves as

research scientist with the Saginaw Valley Research and Development Corporation and has conducted proprietary research in conjunction with Omni Tech International, Ltd.

A resident of Saginaw, Lawrence is noted among his colleagues for having the ability to reach students who are apprehensive about science. Dr. Lawrence's students often make positive comments about his ability to nurture those who struggle with science topics.

In addition to having published several scholarly papers and delivering a number of addresses, presentations and papers, Dr. Lawrence involves students in research projects and encourages them to present their results at regional and national conferences. He serves as faculty representative and conducts chemistry experiments for Project Get Set, a program that encourages junior high and high school minority and women students to study science and engineering. Dr. Lawrence also participated as a judge for the 1993 Tuscola County Academic Games and as a finalist judge of the Saginaw County Science and Engineering Fair.

Prior to joining the SVSU faculty, Dr. Lawrence was an assistant professor of chemistry at Rockhurst College. He was a consultant to the McDonnell-Douglas Corporation's Division of Analytical Chemistry, and a consultant to the Department of Obstetrics/Gynecology and Biological Chemistry at the Washington University School of Medicine in St. Louis.

# THE 1994-95 EARL L. WARRICK AWARD FOR EXCELLENCE IN RESEARCH



DR. TIRUMALE K. RAMESH
ASSOCIATE PROFESSOR OF
ELECTRICAL ENGINEERING

Dr. Tirumale K. Ramesh has amassed a remarkable scholarly record over the past five years while at the same time earning his Ph.D. in computer science and engineering from Oakland University. He holds a bachelor's degree from Bangalore University in Bangalore, India, and an M.S. in electrical engineering from Mississippi State University.

Dr. Ramesh has done extensive research in the field of microelectronics, concentrating on parallel processing with emphasis on reconfigurable parallel computer architectures for scientific and engineering applications. He also is noted for his research on VLSI (Very Large Scale Integrated) design issues in parallel processing computer systems. He is one of the key contributors to the development of test chips and circuit libraries for VLSI technology that are widely used today in many VLSI design tools at major academic and non-academic institutions.

Dr. Ramesh's research papers have been published extensively, with more than 20 of his scholarly papers in the proceedings of major national and international conferences and journals. A bibliography of major publications in the last five years in reconfigurable architectures includes three of Dr. Ramesh's research papers. Compiled by Hitachi Ltd. of Japan, this bibliography has been included in a special issue, titled "Dynamic Reconfigurable Architectures," of the *Journal of Parallel Processing Letters*.

In addition to disseminating his knowledge to engineering students at SVSU, Dr. Ramesh is a highly-sought speaker at technical seminars at major research centers and institutions in India and other places. He regularly reviews technical manuscripts submitted to international conferences and computer journals. Dr. Ramesh, who joined the SVSU faculty in 1984, resides in Saginaw with his wife and two children.

## **ACADEMIC ATTIRE**

Traditions for recognizing academic accomplishments with ceremony, color and distinctive dress have existed for several centuries, dating to European universities of the Middle Ages. The academic regalia worn by participants in today's commencement procession symbolizes the degrees held and the institutions where degrees were earned. The style of these caps, gowns and hoods evolved from costumes worn during early religious processions to distinguish church and university members from the laity.

Bachelor's and master's degree gowns traditionally are black, although some universities prescribe a school color for their graduates' gowns. The bachelor's gown has long pointed sleeves while the master's gown has a sealed oblong section at the wrist. Doctoral gowns are identified by bell-shaped sleeves with velvet crossbars.

The length of the academic hood, which drapes over the back of the gown, denotes the wearer's academic achievement. The hood's length, width, color of trim and the color or colors of the lining all are symbolic. Linings, exposed in the center of the hood, indicate the colors of the degree-granting institution. For Saginaw Valley State University the colors are cardinal red and royal blue. The trim satin for a master's degree, velvet for a doctorate reveals the wearer's major field of study. Width of the trim is two inches, three inches and five inches for the bachelor's, master's and doctor's degree, respectively. The master's hood is pointed; the doctor's hood is bell-shaped. The hood's length is three feet for the bachelor, three and a half for the master and four for the doctor.

The customary head covering is either the mortarboard or a soft beret modeled after the cap of Cambridge University. The tassel on the cap may be black or a color indicating the degree.

The SVSU Board of Control and the President wear regalia especially designed for them in SVSU's colors. Members of the governing board of an institution are entitled to wear doctoral gowns regardless of their academic degree.

# THE SEAL OF SAGINAW VALLEY STATE UNIVERSITY

The triangle within the SVSU seal symbolizes the geographical area formed by Bay City, Midland and Saginaw. It denotes the linking of three separate communities and surrounding areas through an institution dedicated to higher education.

Three symbols within the seal are of Egyptian origin. The figure at the top represents life, denoting that education is an ongoing, life-long process and has a value that lasts forever.

The symbol at the lower left represents light—perhaps the inner light. It recognizes that our knowledge is a torch of smokey pine that lights the pathway but one step ahead. Opposite the light of knowledge in the lower right corner is a staff, which stands for strength. This may be regarded as an appeal for the endurance necessary to search for and find the truth, as well as the strength to speak and live it.

The year of the University's founding, 1963, appears below the triangle.
