

Page 327, line 3 from the bottom....I think a little more needs to be said about how JUDY feels about the incident with MICHAEL. Page 344 ..Middle...Actually it is unlikely that Judy would be telling the chopper pilot what to do...the SWAT guy is more likely, but this is fiction, right? I like it.

Page 345, line 3 from the bottom...the stubby shotgun is an MP-5.

Page 348 ...Line 6 from the bottom...Change "...she bent double" to "bent over".

Page 348, last paragraph...She'd be calling the command post, (not headquarters) and they would be the ones to deploy FEMA, and they'd call for the ambulances, etc. Also, she neglected to tell them that the chopper crashed, the pilot (and SWAY guy?) are dead and two local police were killed...that would be the first thing she'd mention.
