


MEMORANDUM

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I told Jay that we were in the courtyard normally twice a week for one hour each. Our routine during the day was as follows:

We would be awakened at 6:00 a.m. We would then proceed to clean ourselves; have breakfast consisting of bread and tea, by the way, the bread was usually stale. The rest of the morning was spent doing nothing. We would have lunch around 11:30 which consisted of rice, bread and tea. Afternoons were usually pretty dull. Normally we would be given tea mid afternoon; evening meal around 6:00 p.m. which consisted of rice, bread and tea. We normally would have tea again around 9:00 and at 10:00 p.m. back to bed. Variations to this would be when we had visitors which was usually once or twice a week. Interesting enough, our cell faced the courtyard. When the prisoners had visitors they would lower blinds in front of the windows from the outside of the building so that we could not see the activity in the courtyard during the time that visitors were entering the prison.

There were about 20 guards in the small prison. The elite group of guards I talked about was a group of an additional 20 but we would only see them in the morning in the courtyard when they had reveille. I was never able to determine what happened to them during the day.

I will attach a drawing of what the inside of the prison looked like.

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Some of the books I read were "The Thorn Birds", "The Guinness Book of World Records", "Hawaii", "Airport", "The Final Diagonus", and F. Lee Bailey's book.
