

Poet Santos to be awarded Roethke Prize

Poet and essayist Sherod Santos will receive the eighth Roethke Poetry Prize during a special ceremony Thursday, Oct. 17 at SVSU. Santos is being honored for his book *The Pilot Star Elegies*, a National Book Award finalist and one of five nominees for *The New Yorker* Book Award. The Roethke Prize awards ceremony will take place at 7:30 p.m. in the Rhea Miller Recital Hall.

A dinner will precede the presentation at 6 p.m. in Curtiss Hall. Cost is \$20 and reservations may be made by calling ext. 6017.

Santos is the author of three other books of poetry, *Accidental Weather*, *The Southern Reaches* and *The City of Women*.

He also is the author of a book of literary essays, *A Poetry of Two Minds*, a finalist for the National Book Critics Circle Award in Criticism. A new collection of poems, *The Pershing*, is due for release in January 2003.

The Roethke Poetry Prize marks its 34th anniversary in 2002. It is given every three years to encourage and foster work by poets of U.S. citizenship. It is named in honor of Theodore Roethke, a Saginaw poet who received the Pulitzer Prize and two National Book Awards.

Susie Emond, the 2002 Rush Lecturer, will challenge teachers to "High-Stakes Teaching (not Testing): The True Test for Us As Educators." Emond's lecture will take place at 4 p.m., Thursday, Oct. 10 in Founders Hall.

Since the early 1990s, Emond said, school reform has been driven by corporate America, encouraging teachers to better prepare students. She said that needs to be done not just through testing.

SVSU and Delta students team up for Rotaract

In a show of solidarity of purpose, SVSU and Delta College students have teamed up to charter a chapter of Rotaract — higher education's version of Rotary International.

The two institutions will formalize the chapter during a charter ceremony on Friday, Oct. 11 in Curtiss Hall. SVSU President Eric R. Gilbertson and Delta President Peter D. Boyse will address the group. Donald L. Newport, president of Alpena Community College and Rotary District Governor of District No. 6310, also will speak.

The group meets twice per month. In addition to the goals of providing leadership and professional development opportunities, the chapter will conduct one community, one international and one vocational service project each year.

Four Rotarians, charter members of the Rotary Club of Saginaw-Sunrise, are coordinating the new organization: Wynn McDonald, assistant director of Career Planning and Placement, and Woody Pelton, director of International Programs. Winnie Black and Habib Kheil from Delta also serve as advisors.
