Dr. Samuel D. Marble has announced a number of personnel changes for the College.

2. Dr. Curtis McCray will be Dean of the College of Liberal Arts and Basic College.

2. Dr. Walter James will be Dean of a new College of Professions. This new college, Dr. William H. Capitan said, will include these career programs: Engineering and Technology, Nursing, Criminal Justice, Youth Services, Community Services, Data Processing, and Journalism. It also will incorporate Cooperative Education. A director for the program of Engineering and Technology is being sought and is expected to be on hand by September.

Dr. Levine and Dr. Gillespie will return to teaching as full professors. Dr. Levine will be in Chemistry, and Dr. Gillespie in Engineering and Technology.

Saginaw Valley College will begin a self-study on Friday for accreditation by the North Central Association on master degree programs offered by the College. Dr. Dominic Guzetta of the University of Akron, the North Central consultant, will be on the campus Friday.

SVC now offers master of arts in teaching, and hopes to offer a masters degree in Human Biology. North Central Association accreditation can open the door to other master degree programs.

Dr. Harold Peterson is chairman of the NCA Accreditation effort. He has asked for full cooperation of the entire college to meet an August 31 deadline to deliver the final document to the NCA.

The State Senate Appropriations Committee has reported the Higher Education Bill. SVC's in it for \$2,697,400, as compared to \$2,479,000 last year. However, the bill contains two big line items--\$25,000 for a Zilwaukee Sewer charge, and \$25,000 for a Polish Institute. The bill now moves to the House where it is subject to change. Final passage by the Legislature may come in July. The Senate approved the Masters Degree in Human Biology and added \$48,000 to the college's budget.

SVC faculty members and students can attend our Fine Arts Department's production of "White Horse Inn" at Frankenmuth's Bavarian Inn at reduced rates. Ron Kieft, theatre director, said faculty members and students will be admitted for \$1 each upon presentation of identification at the box office. The box office is at the Frankenmuth Gallery of Fine Art, 775 S. Main, Frankenmuth. Performance dates are July 17 through August 5 except there will be no show on July 23 or July 30, both Mondays. Curtain time is 8 p.m. on weekdays and Sundays, 6 p.m. and 9 p.m. on Saturdays. Seating is limited, so make reservations in advance.
