The Human Relations Committee appeared before the Board of Control last night and accused the administration of not following proper hiring practices. The matter was referred to Dr. William H. Capitan, and a report will be made back to the Board.

Property in Dexter previously given to the College by an anonymous donor was sold by the SVC Development Fund for \$100,000. The buyers are the present operators who have been leasing the building for their business.

The Board vetoed the proposed "Sale of Courses" set for this evening on the grounds that cut-rate prices for courses would discriminate against those students who signed up during regular registration periods at the normal tuition rate.

Approval was given by the Board for the college to file a proposal with the Federal Office of Education for a grant under the new Title III regulations. This proposal must be in Washington by October 1.

The library on Monday began an experimental evening reference service. A reference librarian will be on duty Monday through Thursday evenings until 9 p.m. in addition to the regular daily hours of 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Library hours have not changed. The library is open from 8 a.m. to 10:30 p.m. Monday through Friday, 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. Saturday, and 11:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Sunday. Faculty members are asked to tell their evening students of the new reference service, however.
