The Board of Control met last night and elected new officers. Charles B. Curtiss of Bay City is Board Chairman, succeeding William A. Groening, Jr. of Midland who did not seek reappointment to the Board this year. Other officers are: Vice-chairman, John W. Kendall of Detroit; Secretary, Mrs. Ned S. Arbury of Midland, and Treasurer, Melvin J. Zahnow of Saginaw.

New Board member, John Cartwright of Orchard Lake, was welcomed to the Board, and Mr. Zahnow, who was reappointed to a second eight-year term, was congratulated.

Jim Barcia, Student Government president, announced the bust of Dr. Marble will be presented to the College at a 11 a.m. ceremony November 27th, in the library of Wickes Hall, as part of the Tenth Anniversary program. The bust is a gift to the school by the students, and the sculpture was done by Marshall Fredericks of Royal Oak.

Students have challeneged the administration to a basketball game on November 28th as part of the Tenth Anniversary festivities. The challenge was accepted. The teams will be co-ed. No male Chauvinists allowed.

The Board also established the position of Director of Development for the seeking of funds from private individuals, corporations, and foundations. Part of this program will be in the area of Deferred Giving. The motion provided \$20,000 from undesignated contributed funds to finance the office operation for the balance of this fiscal year. No regular operating money will be used. Candidates for this position are being sought.

Dr. William Smith, president of the SVC Faculty Association, said the association's executive committee found the "Design for a Second Decade" unacceptable in its present form, and asked time for more study. The Board received the report, and pointed out the document is not intended to be a firm position for ten years but rather would be reviewed each year.

The Director of Admissions is seeking a half-time Admissions Counselor with the following qualifications: "...The duties will be similar to those performed by the present counselors.
