Tom Renna has authored a book entitled "Church and State in Medieval Europe, 1050-1314," published by the Kendall-Hunt Publishing Company of Dubuque, Iowa. The book is an introduction to the study of medieval Europe through a few test cases involving France, Germany, and Italy. Renna has erected a model which portrays some of the period's major political, institutional, cultural, and religious developments, and introduces some of the main themes of that era.

Mike Mills, former sports editor at the Hillsdale Daily News, has been named Sports Information Director. He began his duties at SVC on August 1st.

SVC's state appropriation for the 1974-75 fiscal year was increased by \$312,000 from last year's budget. The college's new total from the State general fund this year is \$3,058,000. Tuition payments should increase the amount to nearly \$4 million. The money will be used to improve the physical education program, the nursing program, the College of Business Administration, the Master of Arts in Teaching programs, new faculty members, and salary adjustments.

Mrs. Elsie Gaunt has resigned her position as Director of Nursing in order to do a year's residency training toward her doctorate's degree at the University of Michigan. Her resignation is effective August 31.

The college has received a three-year grant of \$25,000 annually from the Strosacker Foundation of Midland for a program in Applied Philosophy. The program is designed to teach leadership qualities to students. The money will be used to establish the Strosacker Chair of Applied Philosophy, and the search for a professor to develop and teach in the program is underway.

Construction work at Doan Center has moved outside, as work begins on the \$375,000 addition. The 8,000-foot addition is expected to be completed by March.

Dr. Timothy T'so, professor in the College of Health Sciences, has received a \$2,000 research grant from Parke, Davis & Co. of Kalamazoo.

Terry L. Flatt, from Southeastern Iowa College, Burlington, Iowa, and Dr. Charles T. Brown, from Eisenhower College, have been hired as assistant professors of Music. Flatt will develop singing groups, and Dr. Brown will develop instrumental groups on the campus. Both will start in September.

The Second Annual SVC Board of Fellows Golf Day took place July 31. There were 18 four-somes. Enough money was raised to defray the expenses of the golf team's trip to Aberdeen, South Dakota, for the NAIA finals.
