As of last night, the college enrolled 2,186 fall semester students for 22,921 credit hours. In response to the surge in freshman enrollments (up 61 per cent), the college has added extra sections of Natural Science, English, Accounting, and Economics. Final registration figures last fall were 2,254 students and 22,717 credit hours.

Eighty-five football players have been practicing twice a day in preparation for the team's first scrimmage game this Friday at Northwood Institute at 2 p.m. The team is under the direction of head coach, Frank "Muddy" Waters; offensive co-ordinator, Jim Larkin; offensive quarterbacks, Frank "Merky" Waters; offensive backfield, George Perry; offensive ends, Joe Flynn; defensive co-ordinator, Andy Kincannon; defensive linebackers and centers, Al Pettyplace; and defensive backfield, Archie Robinson.
