## CAMPUS NOTES

Gene Hamilton and Walter McKinnie of Dow Chemical Company will be co-chairmen of a Minorities Professional Career Conference hosted by the Flint Chamber of Commerce's National Allience of Businessmen on November 20 in the Flint IMA. The two were co-chairmen of a similar conference, hosted by area industry, in Saginaw last March. Colleges invited to participate in the Flint conference include SVC, University of Michigan-Flint, Mott Community College, General Motors Institute, and the Baker Business Institute.

Hamilton was one of the authors of an article entitled "Freshman Grades and Part-Time Emoloyment: A New Look at a Perennial Concern," printed in the Spring 1974 issue of the Michigan Personnel and Guidance Journal, the publication of the Michigan Personnel and Guidance Association. Hamilton and Dr. Kent Beller, assistant professor of educational guidance at Eastern Michigan University and Dr. Dev Pathak, former assistant professor of marketing at SVC, conducted a survey to determine the relationship between part-time student employment and the grade point averages of freshmen students employed at SVC during the 1971 winter semester. The survey concluded that those students with academic-type employment showed greater improvement on their GPA's than those with non-academic-type jobs.

Dr. Thomas Renna has published "The Populis in John of Paris' Theory of Monarchy" in Tidjschrift Voor Rechtsgeschiedenis (Review of Legal History), published in Belgium.

Dr. Peter Moehs has published a review article entitled "Synthesis and Properties of Disilthiane-Containing Compounds" in Reviews on Silicon, Geranium, Tin and Lead Compounds. The article was co-authored by Gary E. LeGrow of the Dow-Corning Corporation.

Dr. Barron Hirsh's article, "Art as Therapy for Juvenile Delinquents," has been accepted for publication by Leonardo, the international journal of art and science published at Oxford, England. The paper is a report on the structure and experiences of the art program he directed at the Saginaw County Juvenile Center, where SVC students were used as art teachers.

Campus Ministry is hosting an open house today and tomorrow from 12 noon to 5 p.m., in the Campus Ministry Center, Dorm C-4.

Key Largo, a gangster melodrama starring Humphrey Bogart, Lauren Bacall, and Edward G. Robinson, will be shown this Thursday at 1 and 9 p.m., Friday at 1 p.m., and Sunday at 8 p.m.

David Johnson has been named head resident of the SVC Residence Halls. Johnson was employed by the Saginaw County Mental Health Department.

SVC is applying for a basic grant under HEW Aid to Developing Institutions. The application is being made for funds for an Institutional Research Office.

The college graduated 59 students at the end of the last semester in August: 50 with baccalaureate degrees, and nine with master of arts in teaching degrees.

As of yesterday, the college had enrolled 2,542 students for fall semester, a 13 per cent increase over last year. These students generated 25,734 credit hours, a 14 per cent increase over the credit hours generated last fall. SVC is one of the few institutions to show such increases in enrollments.
