## THANKSGIVING CAMPAIGN

The Campus Ministry is sponsoring a "Say It With Bread" campaign from November 11 to November 22. During these two weeks, everyone is being asked to give up one meal, and contribute the money which would have been spent on that meal to "Bread For the World," a New York-based, non-denominational organization which purchases food for the starving people of the world.

"We are not simply asking for a contribution," said Rev. Fr. James Fitzpatrick, director of the Campus Ministry Center. "We are asking the people on campus to deny themselves a meal in order to put food in the mouths of the starving."

The event has been timed to coincide with Thanksgiving, Fitzpatrick said. "We are a rich and prosperous nation, and have much for which to be thankful. But we have to realize that our prosperity is not entirely of our making. We use the lion's share of the world's resources, and thus have a special responsibility to share our abundance."
