BOARD OF CONTROL

Dr. Robert Yien, Faculty Association representative, and the Student Government welcomed Dr. Jack Ryder as president of SVC, and thanked Dr. Walter James for his service as acting president.

Dr. James announced that the college has received a matching grant from HEW under Title VI-A, for \$30,000. Matching funds from Forward '71 will total \$33,364. Approximate allocations are: \$26,000 for general campus-wide use, \$3,500 for the College of Education, \$8,000 for Engineering and Technology, \$12,000 for Psychology, and \$14,000 for Theatre.

Dr. James reported that \$4,000 has been allocated from the Forward '71 fund to Special Projects for the following events: Play Festival, Math Olympics, Science Open House, French Day, Roethke Awards, Sociology Project, and Observatory Project.

Dr. William Owsley was granted early retirement and appointed Professor of Biology Emeritus effective June 30, 1975.

Ms. Kay Harley reported that the student exchange program with Poulton-Le-Fylde Teacher College in England has received donations and pledges enabling the program to continue. The Board endorsed the program, and Harley said students from England are expected to visit SVC this April.

The Board approved the expenditure of \$2,500 for architect and designer fees for work done on the proposed stadium by the firm of Grables, Mills, and Young; and \$3,000 for soil borings for the stadium.

Albert Napier, an evening student, asked the Board for compensation for his coat which was damaged last Tuesday night when a smoke bomb landed on it during a class. He was told that the college's insurance doesn't cover such incidents.

A group of Polish citizens asked the Board for an accounting of the line item appropriation for the Institute of Polish Studies.
