Maurice E. Brown, a founder of Saginaw Valley College and a member of its Board of Control for eight years, died last night. Brown helped organize Delta College, and served as chairman of the Delta College Board of Trustees. He was active in Saginaw affairs, and was a mayor of the city.

Paul Still's "Story Theatre" will be the inaugural production of the college's Theatre Arts Department in the renovated theatre building this Friday and Saturday at 8 p.m. and Sunday at 4 p.m.

SVC's first Annual Football Banquet will take place at 7 p.m. Thursday, December 12, at the Bavarian Inn, Frankenmuth. Students, faculty, and administration are invited. The cost is \$8 per person.
