Dr. Walter James has been selected to appear in the twelfth edition of the Dictionary of International Biography, which is published from the International Biographical Centre in Cambridge, England.

Dr. Margaret Cappone has been selected to appear in the 1976 Bicentennial Memorial Edition of Community Leaders and Noteworthy Americans, which is published by the American Biographical Institute.
