Summer theatre has moved from Frankenmuth's Fischer Opera Haus to SVSC's Theatre Building..... The college's Music Department will present "Victoria," a two-act musical comedy, this Friday through Sunday at 8 p.m. The play, with lyrics by Chris Hamilton and music by Marcia Hamilton, is based on the romance between Queen Victoria and her consort Albert. Terry Flatt will stage and direct the performance.

The celestial show sponsored by the SVSC Observatory and the Sunset Astronomical Society will also be held this week-end, from 8:30 p.m. to 11:30 p.m., Friday through Sunday. Dr. Brian Chow said the show provides a good opportunity for star-gazers to view celestial objects through a variety of telescopes, including the college's 16-inch Schmidt-Cassegrain. The college will be the site of the spring meeting of the Association of Chicanos for College Admissions this Friday. The group, designed to encourage students of Spanish-speaking background to remain in school and continue their education, will meet in the Board Room of Wickes Hall. Lynn Herkstroeter has received her doctor of philosophy degree in French from the University of Wisconsin, with her major area of study 18th Century literature. Her dissertation was entitled "An Evaluation of Montesquieu's Lettres Persanes Based on His Essai Sur Le Gout." Ms. Herkstroeter earned her master of arts degree from Middlebury College in Vermont and the University of Paris, and her AB degree from Washington University in Missouri.

Classes will meet on week-ends or week-days in the last week of June and July. The fee is \$50 plus tuition.
