CAMPUS NOTES

Dr. Thomas Renna has received the Elliott Prize from the Medieval Academy of America. He received the honor for his article "Kingship in the <u>Disputatio Inter Clericum Et Militem"</u> (Speculum, 1973).

The Elliott Prize is awarded to an American or Canadian scholar whose article, in the Academy's opinion, is the best first article on any subject of medieval studies published in 1973.

The Prize was established in 1971 in honor of Dr. Van Courtlandt Elliott.

Dr. Renna recently presented a paper entitled "Abelard and St. Bernard: An Event in Monastic History" at the 10th Conference in Medieval Studies, which was held at Western Michigan University.

Dr. Raymond E. Tyner has been selected to appear in the 1976 edition of "Men of Achievement," published by the Melrose Press Ltd., of Cambridge, England. The edition is scheduled to contain biographies of 8,000 men.

Miss Patricia Hurley, daughter of Patrick Hurley who was Secretary of Defense and Ambassador to China under President Franklin D. Roosevelt, will present another viewpoint on the origins of the Cold War this Thursday from 2 p.m. to 4 p.m. in the Wickes Lecture Hall. Miss Hurley, whose visit is sponsored by the SVSC Student Government, is on a nationwide speaking tour for the John Birch Society. She will give background to the ouster of General Chiang Kai-shek from China, and the resulting Communist take-over.

Summer sessions of Freshman Orientation have been scheduled to introduce approximately 450 students to SVSC. Dates for the program are: June 10, 17, and 24; July 8, 22, and 29; and August 12 and 19.

All students will take STEP tests in English expression, writing sample, math computation, and reading before being counseled and pre-registered. Their test results will be interpreted so that necessary course recommendations may be made. The staff for Freshman Orientation includes: Dr. Thomas Hearron, Dr. Robert Braddock, Dr. Charles Brown, Dr. Merlyn Mondol, and Dr. William Byas. Mrs. Louise Ferris directs the program.

The Media Services Department has acquired, under terms of a federal grant, new AV equipment. The equipment includes:

- a Telex high-speed audiotape duplication system which makes cassette copies of open-reel and cassette original records at 1/6 the normal playing time.
 - Audiotronics cassette-tape players, for overnight check-out by students.
- Filmstrip cassette projectors, which advance filmstrips automatically and are used for commercially-produced filmstrip/cassette instructional units.
- Slide/cassette projector systems, which advance slides automatically. Programs can be automated by the Media Services Department which can also photograph illustrations, original graphics, etc., to produce slides.

- Super-8 sound movie cameras and projectors, so live sound can be recorded with original photography.

- a Bowens Illumitran slide copier, for duplicating slides.
