This individual must prepare presentations on Chrysallis services and activities, lay out and design programs and other promotional material, prepare budgets, and be willing to work Saturday and evening hours as demanded for the success of the program. Candidates must have a BA degree in sociology and/or psychology; six months experience with the Chrysallis Program; the ability to relate well to faculty, staff, students, and volunteers; and a good working knowledge of the administrative structure of SVSC. Salary - \$7,000 year.

-Part-time Secretary II to the Director of Evening College and Continuing Education, with a pay rate of \$61.00 per week.

- Secretary II to the Dean, College of Liberal Arts, with a pay rate of \$122.00 per week.

- Director of Safety and Security. - Full-time or Part-time instructor in Criminal Justice. Candidates must be able to teach a number of courses in an upper-division Criminal Justice Program such as Social and Political Problems in Law Enforcement, Advanced Criminal Investigation, and Highway Traffic Management. Potential for leadership in Program growth will also be considered. The position requires a combination of experience and master degree-level training in the Criminal Justice field. The rank is assistant or associate professor. Salary is negotiable.
