PROFESSIONAL PRACTICES COMMITTEE: DEADLINES AND PROCEDURES

Dr. Curtis McCray announced today the Professional Practices Committee has established the following deadlines for application, file preparation, and PPC action:

-TENURE (effective July 1, 1976)

- a) Application to PPC; PPC file in readiness October 10
- b) Decision by PPC October 27

-SABBATICAL (for academic 76-77)

- a) Application to PPC; PPC file in readiness October 10
- b) Decision by PPC November 11

-PROMOTION (effective July 1, 1976)

- a) Application to PPC; PPC file in readiness October 10
- b) Decision by PPC February 13

-FACULTY GROWTH AND RESEARCH GRANTS (1976-77)

- a) Application to PPC January 9
- b) Decision by PPC February 20

Faculty should note the following:

1. This is the first and only notice of PPC deadlines that will be issued.
2. Each faculty member is responsible individually for applying and for updating the PPC file.
3. The PPC file is held in the respective dean's office. Instructions for completing the file are available in the appropriate dean's office.
4. The PPC will not act affirmatively on any applicant whose PPC file is not updated.
5. Faculty members are asked to consult Article G of the SVSCFA Contract regarding the PPC file.
6. Questions should be directed to the Chairperson of the PPC.

Dr. Samuel Levine, professor of chemistry, will publish an article entitled "Treatment of a Kinetic Study Using a Tagged Atom with Irreversible, Linear, Solvent Interaction" in the Fall, 1975 issue of the Michigan Academician, which is published by the Michigan Academy of Science, Arts, and Letters.

The first in the college's Bicentennial Lecture Series on the American Revolution will be presented this Thursday, September 25, at 7:30 p.m. in the Theatre Building. The series is co-sponsored by the History Department and the Michigan Daughters of the American Revolution.

The Delta College Planetarium and the SVSC Observatory will cooperatively present a five-week community education course on Astronomy. The course, which begins this Wednesday, September 24, will cover such topics as the structure of the universe, telescopic obstructions, circumpolar constellations, anatomy of the moon, and the autumn constellations. MAILROOM TIPS

Mail goes out of the College at 9:30 a.m. and 2:30 p.m., and goes through Delta College to the Saginaw Post Office. The college receives its mail from Bay City at 11:30 a.m., and Saginaw mail at 12:30 p.m. After receiving the mail, it is sorted and put into correct boxes, or delivered to administrative offices.

All outgoing mail should be sorted into the following categories: Saginaw, Bay City, in-state, and out-of-state. Be sure to mark its class. Save yourself some time by putting your account number on the top envelope, and securing them with a rubber band.

The mailroom clerks ask that you use the outgoing mail slot located above the inter-office box at all times. Remember, the mail room does not sell stamps. All out-going personal letters must contain stamps.
