Dr. Ryder has named the following persons to the Commencement Committee: Stuart Gross, chairman; David Barker, Peg Guimond, Mike Mills, Richard Thompson, and Betty Wineland. Commencement will be held on Saturday, May 1.

Dr. Margaret Cappone, associate professor of psychology, has received official notification that upon the recommendation of the American Biographical Institute, the Bicentennial Committee has selected her to appear in a comprehensive directory entitled "Notable Americans of the Bicentennial Era," which is being published in commemoration of the country's Bicentennial.

On January 26, Dr. Cappone presented a paper entitled "Evaluation and Treatment Procedures for the Elderly Patient" to professionals from public and private community agencies during a day-long symposium chaired by the Planning for Living Outpatient Psychiatric Clinic in Bay City. Her presentation concerned the clinical psychology of old age, and represented a synthesis of experimental research and clinical work conducted by Dr. Cappone within the area of geriatric psychology over the past five years.

Dr. Brian Chow's monograph on the Fast Breeder Reactor is on the agenda of the Congress' Joint Committee on Atomic Energy. Chow was invited to Washington, D.C., and had a two-hour session with the representatives of the Energy Research and Development Administration on January 30. Chow's study, which was published by the American Enterprise Institute, has been the basis of articles published in the Philadelphia <u>Inquirer</u>, <u>Science News</u>, the Detroit <u>Free Press</u>, and the Dayton <u>Daily News</u>.

The college was the site of the Michigan Juvenile Detention Association's Educators Workshop on January 29. Participating in workshop were Dr. Leslie Whittaker, Dr. Donna Read, Clara Tatum, and Mary Parviainen.

Dr. Suk-Koo Yun, associate professor of physics, has published "Incorporation of CP-Violation with a Unified Renormalizable Gauge Theory" in The Physical Review. The article was co-authored by Dr. Yukio Tomozawa of the Randall Laboratory of Physics at the University of Michigan. Yun's other article, also published in The Physical Review, was titled "Classifications and the Leptonic Decay Widths of New Particles in Charm-Color Scheme."

The college received national publicity in a recent column written by James Kilpatrick, who spoke at the college January 27. Kilpatrick described the college's Academy of Applied Philosophy, and briefed the remarks he made during his speech.

The Walter T. James Memorial Pencil Sharpener has been christened and installed in the Student Government Office, third floor, Wickes Hall. Dr. James received the honor for providing the pencil sharpener (after it was revealed during a Student-Administration Liaison meeting that none were available to students).
