HAMILTON, GIBSON HEAD CAREER SERVICES CENTER

Advancement of Eugene J. Hamilton and Mrs. Elizabeth H. Gibson to serve respectively as Director and Assistant Director of the new Saginaw Valley State College Career Services Center was reported today by Dr. Jack M. Ryder, College President. The Career Services Center will merge previously separate agencies dealing with career counseling, placement and cooperative education.

Hamilton, Director of Cooperative Education since 1973, joined S.V.S.C. in 1969 as an Admissions Counselor and was also coach and acting athletic director until 1972. In 1971 he became Director of Scholarships and Financial Aid. He received an A.A. degree from Flint Junior College in 1959, a B.A. from Western Michigan University in 1961, an M.A. from Eastern Michigan University in 1967 and is presently a doctoral candidate at Wayne State University. Before coming to S.V.S.C., he was a teacher, coach and counselor at Flint St. Mary, Mt. Morris St. Mary, and Owosso St. Paul High Schools. Hamilton resides with his wife and two sons at 1981 Maitland, Saginaw.

Mrs. Gibson becomes Assistant Director of the Career Services Center after serving previously as Director of Career Counseling and Placement. She came to S.V.S.C. in 1971 as a Counselor and Coordinator of Placement from Druid High School, Tuscaloosa, Alabama, where she had earlier been a high school counselor and classroom teacher. She received a B.S. degree from Stillman College, Tuscaloosa, in 1952, a Master of Education degree in Social Studies from Wayne State University in

1960 and a Master of Arts endorsement in 1968 in Counseling and Guidance from the University of Alabama, where she earned her Educational Specialish degree in 1971. She and her husband, John Gibson, Jr., live at 142 Ivanhoe, Saginaw, and she has two daughters.
