The concert will consist wholly of original arrangements and features for the various sections of the band, according to Root.

Because the concert will serve as a promotional vehicle for the SVSC band program by introducing the community to the group, the performance is open to the public without charge.

POETRY RECORDING ARTIST AT SVSC NOV. 17

Writer, poet, recording artist and lecturer Nikki Giovanni will present an evening of poetry readings and lecture at SVSC on November 17. Her 7:30 P.M. appearance, in the lower level of Doan Center, is free to SVSC students, faculty and staff, while a \$1.50 general admission fee will be charged.

Records by Ms. Giovanni are distributed through Atlantic Records and include "The Way I Feel", "Like a Ripple on a Pond", and "Truth Is On Its Way". She is also the author of 11 books, including "The Woman and the Man", a poetry volume published last year by the William Morrow Company.

Ms. Giovanni is known as the "princess of black poetry" and according to critics, "to describe her is to attempt to describe the meaning of each of her poems. Her writing is an extension of herself -- clear, uncluttered, and full of wonder and love for people and nature."

\$2500 ACCOUNTING SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM ESTABLISHED

Advanced undergraduate students at SVSC will share \$2500 in scholarships through a new program established by Chapter 7 of the Independent Accountants Association of Michigan. Chapter Chairman Wilson Hall, Jr. of Bay City announced that \$500 in assistance will be provided each year for one or more SVSC students in the field of Accounting. The 60-member Accountants Association chapter encompasses the area bordered by Alma, Tawas City, Bay City, and Saginaw and the group will continue the SVSC program for a minimum of five years.

Mr. Hall, formerly a student at SVSC, stated that he hoped this gift would provide the nucleus for an even larger program of support by area professional and industrial firms, to assist students who might remain in the Valley after graduation.
