BRITISH POET AT SVSC

A book of poetry entitled "In This Transparent Forest" by British poet Jonathan Griffin is being unveiled this week at SVSC. Published by the Green River Press at SVSC, whose editor is Professor of English Dr. Raymond Tyner, the book is Griffin's fifth volume of poetry.

Griffin will read selections from his work at 8 P.M. Wednesday in the Doan Center dining room. His appearance is sponsored by the College English Club and will be followed by a reception.

Griffin is a graduate of New College, Oxford, and has had a varied career as a journalist, writer, diplomat and --during World War II -- as Director of the British Broadcasting Corporation European Intelligence.

Since leaving the foreign service in 1951, he has pursued a full-time writing career. He has published many poetry translations into English, including works by the Portuguese poet Pessoa and by Rene Char. His translation of von Kleist's "The Price of Homburg" was one of two plays chosen to open the new Royal Theatre of Manchester, England this past fall. Griffin's play "The Hidden King" was presented at the Edinburgh Festival in 1957.

SAGINAW, BAY CITY RESIDENTS WIN REDFIELD AWARDS

Winners of the 1976-77 Redfield Prize in Printmaking at SVSC are Clifford Bonamie of Saginaw and Kei Kida of Bay City. According to Dr. Barron Hirsch, Chairman of the Art Department, the prize is presented annually by Saginaw physician and art collector Dr. Nicholas Redfield for excellence in the art of printmaking.

Bonamie, of 3092 Shattuck, Saginaw, won with an etching named "American Classic", a social comment on violence in American society. The winning entry by Kida, of 2432 E. Tennis Court, Bay City, is an etching with aquatint entitled "Schloss Neuschwanstein", a print of a Bavarian castle.

Both winning entries will be on display in the Arts Workshop through February 28, as part of a student printmaking exhibition.

G. JAMES WILLIAMS TO HEAD NEW SVSC FOUNDATION

Selection of G. James Williams, Financial Vice President of The Dow Chemical Company, as chairman of the newly-created Saginaw Valley State College Foundation has been announced by College President Jack M. Ryder.

Purpose of the Foundation will be to achieve financial support for the College from private sources for operations, capital and physical additions, and research projects. According to Dr. Ryder, the Foundation will work to accomplish the educational purposes of SVSC through assistance in an exclusively educational and charitable manner. The newly-created group will attempt to augment facilities at the College and provide more flexible and discretionary use of contributed funds.

Williams and Dr. Ryder are participating with Dr. A. Jefferson Sharp, Vice President for Development and College Relations, in the enlistment of the Foundation's board of directors. Directors will include five incumbent members of the College's Board of Control, three administrative officers and eight friends of the College who have demonstrated concern for its success.

According to Williams, the Foundation has been established to involve volunteers in planning and decision-making in fund raising at SVSC.

Williams, of Midland, joined Dow Chemical Company in 1948 as a member of the Legal Department and became sales manager, Plastics in 1958. Following several promotions, he became Dow Director of Marketing in 1964 and became general manager of Plastics in 1967. After his election to Dow's Board of Directors in August 1968, he became commercial director and was appointed a vice president of the company. He was named to his present position of financial vice president in August 1975, following three and a half years as exec. vice president. He also serves on the executive committee of the Dow Board of Directors and is a director of Dow Corning Corporation and Dow Chemical Investment and Finance Corporation.
