## FIVE SVSC ARTISTS TO SHOW WORKS

Original artwork by five Saginaw Valley State College faculty members, including Barron Hirsch, chairperson of the Art Department, will be exhibited June 29 - July 15 at Galleria Internazionale, 1911 Wieneke Road, Saginaw.

Dr. Hirsch will display examples of prints, paintings, and serigraphs, with emphasis on geometric compositions, complimentary color relationships and ambiguities in visual perception.

Photography instructor Curtis Leece will offer nature derivations in color and black and white photography. Works by Assistant Professor Matthew Zivich will include sculpture plus drawings and paintings of imaginary landscapes, interiors and surrealistic figurative images.

Gayle Leece, instructor of painting, will exhibit still life pieces and figures through paintings, drawings and sculpture. Examples of fiber forms, surface design, feltmaking and papermaking will be displayed by Martha Yeatman, instructor of weaving.

An open house from 7:30 to 11 p.m. June 29 will begin the two-week exhibit, hosted by gallery owners Luciana Weiss and Jill Wiechmann.
