Gilbertson Installed as Third SVSU President

"By virtue of the authority vested in me, I hereby install you as president and entrust this University to your keeping."

With these words by Florence "Jo" Saltzman, chairperson of SVSU's Board of Control, Dr. Eric R. Gilbertson was formally installed as SVSU's third president Tuesday, Nov. 28. An estimated 900 members of the campus and community witnessed the 3 p.m. ceremony in Ryder Center.

Saltzman charged the new president to: provide educational leadership, represent SVSU to the community, set priorities for allocation of resources, strengthen the association between faculty and administration, enhance the diversity of staff and students, maintain a close working relationship with the Board, and assure students of an education not only for a specific career but also for a lifetime pursuit of intellectual nourishment.

In responding to the charge, Gilbertson noted that "institutions, like people, matter very little if they do not stand for something." He continued by stating that SVSU stands for the dignity and worth of each individual, for the ideals of a democratic society, for freedom of inquiry and the free exchange of ideas, for integrity and civility between people, and for the dignity of work.

"The University does stand for great things," he said.


Noting that an inauguration is a new beginning and represents a time for affirming "who we are, what we are and why we are," Gilbertson said, "We are a teaching institution. ... And as we are committed to teaching, so

too must we be committed to learning. ... We are, first and foremost, an institution of opportunity, an institution of and for the people.

"Our mission then, is clear, simple: to provide opportunity for individuals to improve their lives, and to provide ideas and educated people for participation and leadership in an economy and a democracy. This is what we are, why we are."

Gov. James J. Blanchard and 8th District Congressman Bob Traxler were among those who brought greetings to the new president.



Michigan Governor James J. Blanchard brought greetings from the state to incoming President Eric R. Gilbertson. Blanchard told the inaugural audience that we "celebrate the coming of age of SVSU. There is no question," he said, "that the key to the future is brainpower, not braunpower. We need this institution to train our people for jobs of the future and to make sure that they are the kinds of citizens that can give us the healthy society that we need."

SVSU to be Site for House Task Force Hearing

The House Republican Task Force on Educational Approaches that Work will conduct a public hearing at SVSU and two area high schools this Thursday, Dec. 7. The meeting begins at 1:30 p.m. in the Board of Control room, third floor Wickes Hall.

The House study group is interested in learning more about the Greater Saginaw Valley Regional Education Cooperative, funded by a Michigan Department of Education grant and administered by SVSU. The cooperative is an educational partnership arrangement among three regional community colleges, 68 public school districts, nine intermediate school districts and four regional educational media centers, along with SVSU.

The hearing will involve observation of and participation in the two-way interactive video linkage among Hemlock, Merrill and Swan Valley high schools, according to SVSU Vice President for Public Affairs John A. Fallon.

"The purpose of this activity is to explore the promise of the GSVREC and its most unique element, the Greater Saginaw Valley Telecommunications Network," Fallon said.

The task force will hear testimony from GSVREC staff, including Barbara Scott-Parks, director of "Artswork;" Dr. Walter R. Rathkamp, director of the regional math/science center; Clifton Jones, director of the Valley Library consortium; Shirley Rappaport, specialist for professional development; and Dr. Douglas Hansen, director of GSVRTN. Dr. Crystal M. Lange, interim dean of continuing education, will discuss SB-CEU procedures.

At 3 p.m. the group will travel to Swan Valley High School for a brief orientation to the telecommunications system. After the overview, half of the group will visit Hemlock High School and the two groups will use the telecommunications system in a demonstration session.

Other SVSU personnel attending the hearing are Dr. Ralph K. Coppola, executive director of GSVREC; Dr. Elaine C. Stephens, director of GSVR Center for Professional Development; and Dr. Jose Valderas, associate director of the regional math/science center.

Social Work Program Earns Continuing Accreditation

SVSU's bachelor of social work (BSW) program has been granted five years of continuing accreditation from the Council on Social Work Education. The program initially received CSWE accreditation in 1983.

The continuing accreditation, granted with no conditions, was received following an extensive self-study report prepared by department personnel and a site visit by a CSWE team. Barbara McGregor, chairperson of the social work department, attended the Washington, D.C. hearing on re-accreditation.

The specialized accreditation is considered an important measure of the quality of instruction and educational experience offered by SVSU to social work students. Students graduating from CSWE accredited programs qualify for advanced placement in Master of Social Work (MSW) programs, according to Dr. William K. Barnett, dean of the College of Arts and Behavioral Sciences. "Also, many agencies require the BSW degree," he said.

CSWE, headquartered in New York, is the national accrediting body for both undergraduate and graduate programs. The agency establishes standards and certifies schools of social work. It also encourages high standards for selecting students and social workers and assists the continuing professional growth of employed social workers.

Before granting certification, CSWE examines the curriculum, instructional materials, faculty, facilities, administrative support and student field work experiences offered by a social work program. "During the exit interview, the site team complimented our program for the outstanding involvement of professionals in the community," Barnett said.
