

Arbury Fine Arts

Arbury Fine Arts is named in recognition of Ned and Dorothy (Honey) Arbury. Honey Arbury was on the founding board of control for SVC. The building was privately funded. It was through the tireless effort of the Arburys that the vision of a fine arts building on the campus of SVSU was achieved.

The crown jewel of the project was the Marshall M. Frederick Sculpture gallery, later renamed the Marshall M. Frederick Museum in 1999.



Mr. Fredericks artwork and studio were gifted to the University upon his death. In 2003 an addition to the museum was built to house the archives and a simulation of his Woodward Ave. studio. A four classroom addition constructed in 2009 provided much needed classroom and studio space.
