

South Campus Complex A

South Campus Complex (SCC-A) consists of an original 1985 building and a 1992 addition. It was a fast track project constructed in the summer of 1985 to house the campus administrative offices. The administrative offices. located on the north side of Wickes Hall in a series of portable buildings dubbed the Wickes Annex, were destroyed by fire in the spring of 1985. Administrators were temporarily relocated into the dormitories for the summer while the new building was erected.



This often renamed building was originally known as "Administrative Services South" when it housed the campus administrative offices, later as the "CIESIN" building when it was home to the Center for International Earth Science Information Network. It was renamed the "College of Education" between 1996–2003 and finally "SCC-A" in 2004.

It currently houses campus facilities, campus police, business services and the controller's office.
