 COUNCIL FOR INTERNATIONAL EXCHANGE OF SCHOLARS**

Supports proposals to bring scholars and professionals from abroad to U.S. colleges and universities that infrequently or never have the opportunity to host visiting scholars. In addition to teaching courses, scholars give campus-wide and community lectures, help initiate international programs, and contribute to curriculum development. Program is especially appropriate for small liberal arts colleges, minority-serving institutions, and community colleges. ### TENNIS INSTRUCTIONAL IMPROVEMENT THROUGH VIDEO ANALYSIS/FY06

Michael Major, Assistant Director of Career Planning and Placement and Head Tennis Coach, received \$550 from Saginaw Community Foundation for the Tennis Instructional Improvement Through Video Analysis project. The purpose of this grant was to purchase a Dartfish software package that would assist in the video analysis of female tennis players throughout Saginaw County. The software was used on all members of SVSUs Women's tennis program and also introduced to students of a University tennis course. In addition, the software was introduced to the tennis coach of Arthur Hill High School. The results of the project included an improvement of fundamental doubles movement from SVSU tennis players throughout the season.

These grants are considered to be SEED MONEY designed to support research and stimulate the submission of proposals to the agencies for external funding. Any faculty member who has received research support in the last three out of five years will not receive additional award unless a research grant proposal is submitted to at least one outside agency (i.e., the National Science Foundation, National Endowment for the Humanities, Ford Foundation, and others).
