**2006-2007 MATHEMATICS AND
SCIENCE CENTER/FY06**

Walter Rathkamp, Executive Director for Science & Mathematics Education, received \$76,878 from the Michigan Department of Education: Office of School Improvement (Curriculum and Instruction) Mathematics and Science Centers Program for the 2006-2007 Mathematics and Science Center on SVSU's campus. In addition to the funding received from the Office of School Improvement, Saginaw Valley's Math and Science Center also received grants from Title II A(3), Title IIB MSP, and Title II B Science Grant. This funding helped to maintain and improve the Mathematics and Science Center for the 2006-2007 school year. Over the course of the year, the following six areas were addressed by the center: leadership, professional development, student services, curriculum support, and resource clearinghouse. A total of 340 individuals were participants in Professional Development events at the center. These participating teachers were pre-elementary, early elementary, middle school, high school, and mixed level educators. Each teacher spent an average of 23.5 hours on mathematics, science, or technology professional development. The center also focused on teachers in three local high priority school districts, Saginaw, Brideport-Spaulding, and Buena Vista. During the 2006-2007 year, more than 90 teachers in Brideport-Spaulding, 35 teachers in Buena Vista and 50 teachers in Saginaw were impacted through the efforts of the Math and Science Center. The SVSU Math and Science Center has been operating since 2002 and is still operating despite the 75% reduction in funding.

FELLOWSHIP PROGRAM**

The Saginaw Community Foundation will award annual fellowships to two faculty/staff for three-year appointments starting January 1st following the award announcement. Each fellow will receive supporting grants totaling \$37,500 (\$12,500 per year) during the three year term to recognize and further their scholarly or professional activities. Braun Fellows will be expected to produce a body of professional or academic work for publication or presentation during or at the conclusion of the Fellowship term.

SVSU Faculty Research, leading to publication or presentation, is funded at estimated 25 projects yearly; average release time is 3-4 hr/year; average award is \$5,000. These grants are considered to be SEED MONEY designed to support research and stimulate the submission of proposals to the agencies for external funding. Any faculty member who has received research support in the last three out of five years will not receive additional award unless a research grant proposal is submitted to at least one outside agency (i.e., the National Science Foundation, National Endowment for the Humanities, Ford Foundation, and others).
