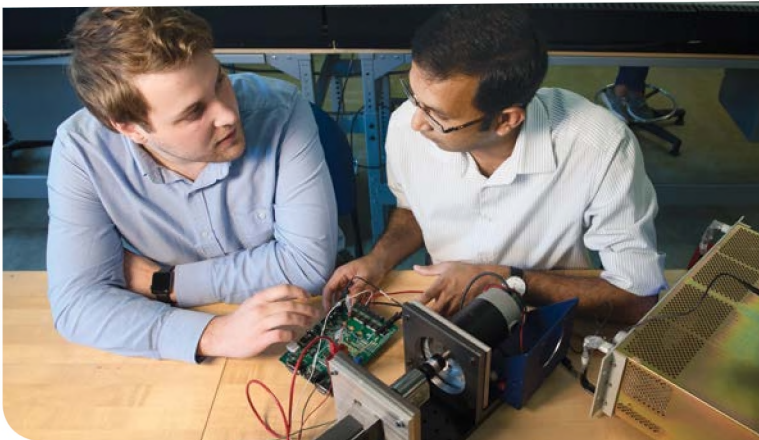

Red & White Scholarship: Students who live outside of Michigan have a standard tuition rate of \$24,000. The good news is that once you apply to SVSU and are admitted, SVSU automatically applies the Red & White Scholarship to your bill, reducing your overall tuition to \$13,680.

Block Tuition: With block tuition, you pay one flat rate when taking 12-18 credits per semester. This credit range is equivalent to about 4-6 classes per semester. That means you pay the same tuition whether you take 12 or 18 credits each semester (24-36 credits per year). This model allows you to take more classes at no extra cost. That means you can graduate in four years (or less!) – save on tuition and living expenses – and start your career sooner.

No Extra Fees: There are no fees for freshman and sophomore students. Professional fees apply only to select junior and senior students.

Your Total Cost of Attendance: Colleges use a “cost of attendance” to help you determine the maximum amount of financial aid you can receive. This total cost includes direct costs you pay to SVSU – such as tuition, housing and a meal plan – plus estimated indirect costs such as books, transportation and personal expenses, which can vary from family to family. At SVSU, the total cost of attendance with these direct and indirect costs is an estimated \$27,180.

FOLLOW THESE STEPS TO FIND OUT YOUR SVSU COST!

Financial aid offers are mailed to all admitted students who listed SVSU on their 2026-2027 FAFSA. Once admitted, you can also visit your student portal to review your financial aid offer.

1. Apply for admission to SVSU. (Include your social security number on your SVSU application for admission. This is the only way your FAFSA is linked to your SVSU account.)
2. Send your official high school transcript to SVSU through parchment.com or have your counselor email a copy to transcripts@svsu.edu
3. Complete your FSA account first, then complete your 2026-2027 FAFSA at fafsa.gov in October.
4. SVSU begins mailing and emailing financial aid offers in December or January.
5. Qualifying students are automatically enrolled in the Cardinal Commitment program (see below).

Students with a 3.95+ GPA who apply and are admitted to SVSU before December 1 are automatically invited to compete for our most prestigious scholarship, which covers 120 credit hours toward your first degree. Final selections are made in February.
