College and Campus Updates (James Tarr)

- Program Changes in Teacher Education
 - Approved and Implemented:
 - English/Language Arts (5-9 & 7-12) – Fall 2023
 - Approved but not Implemented:
 - Mathematics (5-9 & 7-12) – Fall 2024
 - In Development:
 - ACR in Elementary Education – Summer 2025*
 - Integrated Social Studies (5-9 & 7-12) – Fall 2025
 - Pre-Development:
 - ACR in Secondary Education – TBD*
- Rural Educator Credentialing Hub – Funded Partnership
 - \$15 million grant, CMU is fiscal
 - Question regarding the definition of “rural” – we do not have that yet, MDE will determine the parameters

Accreditation, EPI & MTTC (Tamara Barrientos)

- 2024 EPI Score Report from MDE 88/95=92.6% (handout)
- SVSU 2024 MTTC Subject-Specific Pedagogical Knowledge Scores by Category (handout)
 - We passed 7 of the 9 categories to receive 3 out of 5 points on section 2.2 of our score report.

Office of Clinical Experiences (Carl Sztuczko)

- Thanked administrators for support in filling field placements
- This spring 25 candidates are required to completed 9 hours of observation in a special education classroom and we are looking for placements.

- We're receiving more requests to release candidates from student teaching early so they can become long-term subs. Unfortunately, we are not able to honor those requests because our candidates need to get their hours in.
- Currently recruiting ACR candidates
- There was a data request from a board member – where are student teachers in terms of content area. Carl will pull this data together and send it out with the slides and meeting notes.

Redesign of the Accelerated Certification with Residency (ACR) Program (Debbie Lively)

- Teacher Education (TE) –Elementary will...
 - be a 3-6 certification band;
 - include a mix of hybrid and online coursework;
 - involve graduate-level coursework building toward a master's degree
 - be completed in one year
 - begin the summer of 2025
 - include a foundational course-classroom management-classroom planning, etc.
 - be seeking P-12 input
- Grade banding has changed from a K-8 focus. The 3-6 grade band was based on EAB feedback.
- Teacher Education – Secondary & Middle School (TEMS)
 - planning is in process
 - will be considering a master's degree program
 - will involve P-12 partners
 - begin the summer of 2026?
- Anne T.J. shared that master's degrees were not considered in the past because initial program feedback indicated ACR candidates wanted the lowest cost possible. This has changed.

- Small and whole group discussion – How are districts viewing AI? How are districts using AI?
 - Districts are using it but do not have clear guidelines
 - Magic School AI (<https://www.magicschool.ai/>)
 - There are different levels of use
 - Concerns about student use – plagiarism
 - Emphasize using it **properly**

- If we don't show kids how to use it properly, they are going to use it anyway
- Makes life easier for teachers – work smarter, not harder
- Admin pushing it as another tool to help teachers
- There is a lack of policy
- Creating policy is challenging – as soon as it's written, it's immediately out of date
- Tech team has shared AI resources with staff
- Jill recommended a link from our Center for Excellence in Teaching & Learning (CETL) site
- Anne highly recommended SchoolAI (<https://schoolai.com/>)
- Anne shared how AI is used in her teacher education course for writing family communication
