As we approach the end of another semester, I wanted to take a moment to reflect on the incredible work and achievements that we have accomplished together as a community.

- ✓ We continue to increase our collaborative outreach initiatives. We have added the Sanilac County Community Mental Health Authority. We also have the Saginaw County Community Mental Health Authority, the Veteran's Health Administration, Henry Ford Health, and Corwell Health. In addition, we have been working to arrange agreements with health institutions in the upper peninsula.
- ✓ The Anatomage Table which is the world's most advanced real-human medical education platform has been ordered. This state-of-the-art platform offers digitized human cadavers and superior learning tools, transforming health professions education and training. It will be housed in the Department of Kinesiology, however, can be used by all HHS departments. We will figure out a process by which it can be scheduled to be used.
- ✓ As previously mentioned, the nursing department's reaccreditation site visit was on Feb 24-26, 2025. The team worked very diligently and tirelessly to ensure a successful site visit. While we will not get the final word from the commission until end of September, the site team reported the nursing programs MET all standards and did not find any compliance concerns! Congratulations!
- ✓ We will continue to work on the two major projects which include the establishment of the Malcom Field Biomedical Sciences Research Institute (MFBSRI) within Bachand Hall, and the SVSU Graduate Health Sciences Building within the Medical Diamond in downtown Saginaw.



We are in the final two months of the HHS Wellness Challenge. We will celebrate the achievements at our year-long accomplishments at the Wellness Celebration Pot-luck luncheon on April 24th. This will immediately follow the last workshop of the academic year, "immunity to change" presented by Dr. Anthony Palatta. The workshop will begin at 9am and everyone is welcome. HHS GRADS STAND OUT



Graduates of Saginaw Valley State University's nursing program continue to stand out, achieving a 98.55% first-time pass rate on the NCLEX®, the national licensure exam in 2024. Nurses must pass this exam to become licensed and enter the nursing profession. NCLEX reports pass rates at the end of every quarter throughout the year. Through December 31, 2024, 136 Saginaw Valley State University recent nursing graduates passed the NCLEX-RN test, demonstrating their readiness to work. The 2024 first-time pass rate on the NCLEX-RN in Michigan was just shy of 92%, while the national rate was slightly over 91%.

Graduates of Saginaw Valley State University's occupational therapy program continue to stand out. While the final results won't be in until December, currently with a majority of the students taking the exam, OT has a 100% pass rate. The 2023 pass rate for SVSU was 98%, which was significantly higher than the national pass rate of 87%



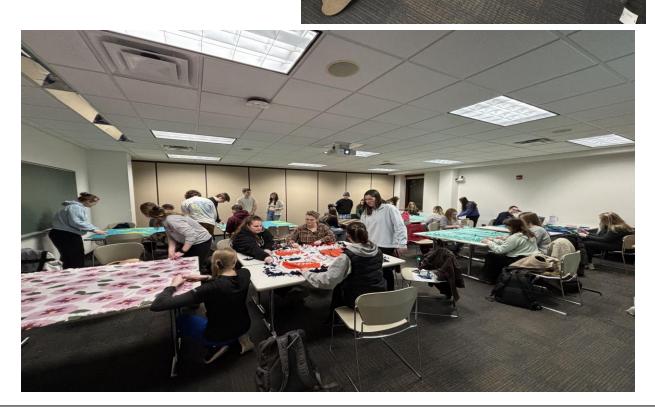

CARDINALS 4 PUBLIC HEALTH (C4PH)

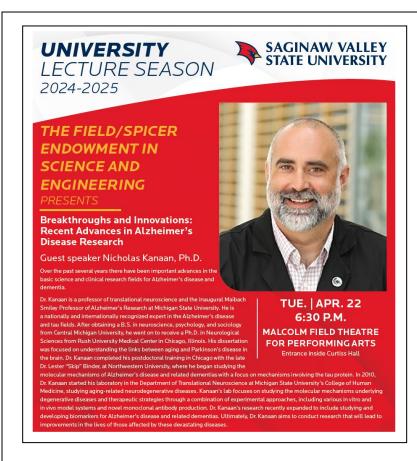

WALKING PROGRAM AND 5K ACTIVITY



The SVSU Walking Program spearheaded by Dr. Gena Guerin, Assistant Professor of Kinesiology, is underway. The 8-week program will run until April 12th.

Currently, there are 190 participants registered for the program. The Week 1 walking tally is 2,483 miles total and 18.5 miles average per participant. To increase adherence and success during the winter, mileage can also be earned by minutes completing other exercise like indoor cycling or taking exercise classes. Kinesiology student volunteers have been leading walks on the Bachand Hall-Gilbertson Hall ½ mile loop at 11am and 1pm Monday through Thursday with expansion across campus being planned.

At the conclusion of the Walking Program, a 5-K memorial walk/run event is being planned for Saturday, April 12th beginning at 9am with a 1K Kids event and the 5-K start time of 9:15am. 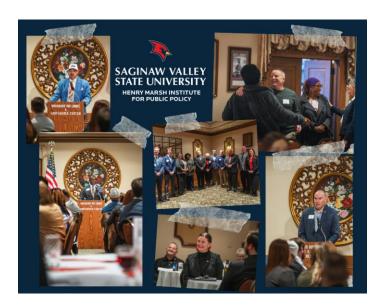

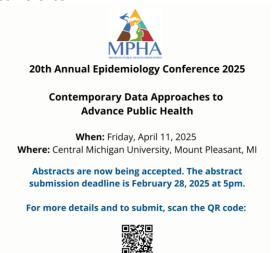
The conference will be held on Friday, April 11, 2025 on the campus of Central Michigan University in Mt. Pleasant.
