## What does the Substance Use Disorders ECHO provide?

This ECHO provides training in substance use disorders at no cost, delivered right to your clinic, with a bi-weekly schedule for your convenience. Using simple videoconferencing technology, healthcare teams connect to a community of learners which offers:

- Free continuing education credit from MyMichigan Health\*, Saginaw Valley State University\*\*, Mid-State Health Network\*\*\*, Michigan Community Health Workers Alliance\*\*\*\*, Marquette-Alger Regional Educational Service Agency\*\*\*\*\*
- Opportunity to present actual patient cases, in a de-identified format, and receive specialty input
- Addiction treatment training that meets new DEA training requirements, including management of buprenorphine/naloxone (e.g. Suboxone) and injectable naltrexone (e.g. Vivitrol)
- Access to a virtual learning community for access to treatment guidelines, tools, and patient resources
