#### **Tour Activity Level:**

This tour requires more than average physical activity. You should be in good health, able to climb stairs and walk reasonable distances, 3-4 hours of physical activity per day, 1-3 continuous miles unassisted within 1-2 hours, possibly over stairs and cobblestones, getting in/out of small canal boats. Adding optional excursions may increase the total amount of walking on your tour. You should feel comfortable managing your own baggage at all times. If you have any mobility concerns or physical restrictions, please contact our OLLI office for additional information. This trip is not accessible for travelers using wheelchairs, scooters, walkers, or crutches.


#### **Travel Requirements:**

## **Day 1: Depart SVSU**

We'll travel to the Detroit airport via motorcoach from SVSU, and fly to Amsterdam, the capital of the Netherlands.

### Day 2: Arrive in Amsterdam & Embark Ship

Today we will arrive in the Netherland capital, home of the Dutch. We will be greeted at the airport and transferred to the M/S River Harmony. You will have some time to settle into your cabin, then you have the option to relax onboard or go for a stroll around the neighborhood where the ship is docked. There will be a light lunch available onboard. In the afternoon, we will gather for our first port talk in the lounge for an informative ship embarkation and safety meeting. During our cruise we will gather for briefings about the port area and town. We will then have dinner onboard the ship in the dining room. Then you have the freedom to spend the rest of your evening as you wish - perhaps you'll enjoy a nightcap at the bar or relax in the lounge. **(D)** 

#### **Day 3: Explore Amsterdam**

After breakfast, we'll begin our day with an Amsterdam canal cruise. While traversing these 400-year-old canals—a UNESCO World Heritage Site - you'll view such landmarks as the 17thcentury Royal Palace and the Mint Tower, which has retained its name even though gold and silver coins were minted here for only a couple of years. You'll also see the wooden double drawbridge, known as the "Skinny Bridge," that may remind you of Van Gogh's paintings. Following lunch, the afternoon is free for your choosing—ask our Program Director for recommendations such as joining a local guide for a guided walk of the city's Jordan neighborhood, also known as its Jewish quarter. Later in the afternoon join travel companions and the ships' crew for a Welcome Drink followed by the Captain's Welcome Dinner. Then in the lounge join for an impactful Exclusive Discovery Series conversation: "Netherlands Networks: Trafficking and Trading". (B/L/D)

## Day 4: Enkhuizen (pronounced "enk-HOW-zen")

In the later morning we will cruise to Enkhuizen, giving you more opportunity for reveling in the springtime scenes that line the riverbanks. Upon arrival we will set off on a walking tour to explore Enkhuizen, established between AD 1000 and 1200. Enkhuizen became a city in 1355, prospering due to its herring fishing industry and trade from the East and West India companies. Enkhuizen reached its peak in the 17th century when it boasted the largest herring fleet in Holland. The thriving port sat on the edge of the Zuiderzee, an inlet of the North Sea, until it was enclosed in 1932. Now, Enkhuizen sits on the Ijsselmeer, the large inland lake created by the damming of the sea outlet.

# Day 4 Continued

With a population of about 16,000, this historic city retains its old charms, and its harbors attract thousands of pleasure boats. You'll also see the Drommedaris, an old defense tower at the entrance to the harbor, and the many warehouses originally used by both the East and West India Company. Dinner will be onboard in the ship's dining room and the evening is yours to spend as you wish. (B/L/D)

#### Day 5: Enkhuizen • Home-Hosted Op de Koffie

This morning we will enjoy a visit with a local family, an Exclusive Discovery Series event. They'll be your hosts for coffee, cake, and conversation, during a Home-Hosted Op de Koffie. Along with a friendly intercultural exchange, you might enjoy tasting a stroopwafel—a thin, waffle-like sandwich cookie with a sweet, chewy center. In the afternoon we will delve deeper into this city's rich maritime history during an included visit to the Zuiderzee Museum, an open-air complex that depicts life in this region in the 19th and early 20th centuries. The evening is yours to spend as you wish. **(B/L/D)** 

# Day 6: Kinderdijk

Today explore Kinderdijk, and its famed 19 windmills. Stroll around the site, with plenty of time to take photos of these nostalgic, yet pragmatic creations. These well-preserved, historic structures became protected by UNESCO in 1997. Kinderdijk takes its name from a 16th-century legend involving a baby (or kinder), a cradle, and a cat that all survived being tossed into raging waters. For centuries, the Dutch were at the mercy of frequent floods. Around 1740, 19 windmills were built in the village of Kinderdijk, innovative structures that drain the excess water from polders—the reclaimed land that is situated below sea level—and pump it into nearby rivers and canals. This helps to evenly distribute water levels and lessen the threat of devastating floods. Nowadays, modern engines do the job of turning the paddle wheels, forcing them to scoop up the water, yet the country still has a unique bond with, and affection for, its many windmills. Next, we will dock in either the medieval town of Schoonhoven or Dordrecht, then set off on a brief walking tour with your Program Director. The rest of the afternoon is yours to explore Schoonhoven at your leisure- ask our Program Director for recommendations. (B/L/D)

## Day 7: Rotterdam • Optional Tour of Delft

After breakfast the choice is yours: Either begin the morning on a walking tour of Rotterdam, which was almost completely destroyed during World War II. The reconstructed city is now known for its crisp, modern architecture. **Or**, join the optional tour of Delft's famous porcelain factory. One of the member cities of the Dutch East India Company, Delft is known for its blue-and-white pottery (called Delftware). Visit a local porcelain factory and enjoy a short walking tour of Delft. Following the walking tour, you will enjoy lunch in a local restaurant. No matter the morning activity that you choose, enjoy the afternoon to make your own discoveries in Rotterdam. Following dinner, head to the lounge to enjoy live entertainment from local musicians. (*B/D*)









## Day 8: Rotterdam • Keukenhof Flower Park • Tulip Farm Visit

Today we will enjoy a quintessential Netherlands in springtime experience this morning—the Keukenhof Flower Park. Set in the heart of the western Netherlands' tulip-growing region, and once the kitchen garden of a medieval castle, today it is known as the "greatest flower show on Earth," featuring more than seven million tulips and a variety of other flowers in both indoor and outdoor exhibits. You'll have the opportunity to stroll through the park's 70 acres of lovely, tree-shaded grounds with ponds, winding paths, streams, and fountains; then enjoy a boxed lunch at Keukenhof Flower Park. In the afternoon we'll meet with a local family and learn about the daily life of modern tulip farmers during this Exclusive Discovery Series. (*B/L/D*)

### Day 9: Province of Zeeland, the Netherlands

Depending on our docking location, we will visit one of two villages: artist-friendly Veere or, the medival town of Zierikzee. Our Program Director will share information about the town as we stroll, each one charming and rich with over a thousand years of history. Then there will be some free time before returning to the ship for lunch. The remainder of the day is yours to choose, either relax aboard the ship or explore the area at your own pace. (B/L/D)

#### Day 10: Ghent, Belgium

Today we will visit one of Belgium's oldest cities and its fourth largest, Ghent, "the jewel of Flanders." Enjoy an included walking tour here that will immerse you in the city's rich history. Medieval and Renaissance buildings tell the story of Ghent's past reign as a textile capital from the eleventh century onward, both more populous and wealthier than London for several centuries. When the people of Ghent were under Spanish rule and rose up against Charles V to protest taxes, he punished the city by making its nobles parade before him wearing nooses around their necks. This led to the term *stroppendragers*—noose-wearers—becoming the nickname for Ghent-dwellers since. Enjoy free time in this Flemish treasure before returning to the ship. The afternoon is free for your own discoveries. In the late afternoon, we will have another onboard Exclusive Discovery Series conversation—"Belgium Today." The evening is yours to enjoy. (B/L/D).

#### Day 11 Antwerp • Captain's Farewell Dinner

This morning, we will leave the ship and board our private motorcoach for the 15-minute drive into town. Then, set off on a walking tour of Antwerp. Located on the banks of the Schelde River, Antwerp is Belgium's major port and has been commercially important in European trade since the eleventh century. Like Amsterdam, it is one of the world centers for diamond trading. In spite of damage suffered during both World Wars, Antwerp remains a city full of beautiful historic architecture dating back to the 16th century. We'll explore Antwerp's well-preserved Old Town, built around the *Grote Markt* (Town Square), and graced by the lovely old Town Hall and guild houses, then stroll along the *Meir* (Antwerp's main shopping street), lined with wonderfully elaborate historic buildings. The afternoon, is free for your own discovery. Later this afternoon, return to the ship for an Exclusive Discovery Series conversation about the complicated history of Belgian colonialism and the effects of racism today. Following the talk, join our ship's captain for a Farewell Drink and Dinner in the dining room. (*B/L/D*)

#### Day 12 Antwerp • Disembark Ship • Brussels • Return to U.S.

Following breakfast, we will be transferred to the airport in Brussels for our return flight home. (B)

#### Day 7: Delft\*

Dating back to the 13th century, Delft was a longtime home port to the Dutch East India Company. It is well known for its blue-and-white pottery called Delftware, which was first produced in the 17th century and styled after imported Chinese porcelain. You'll learn more about the unique pottery during a visit to a local porcelain factory. You'll also enjoy a brief walking tour of the city.
