

General Information:

Travel Providers

This educational travel experience is offered by the SVSU Osher Lifelong Learning Institute in conjunction with Go Ahead Tours. GAT was the travel provider for our Tuscany, Canadian Rockies, Ireland trips plus many more.

Registrations:

Please fill out the registration form and bring it to the OLLI office on the day of registration. Trip reservations are on first-come-first served basis. A passport and Covid vaccination card is required at time of registration and the passport must be valid through six months following the end date of the tour.

Tour Activity Level:

This tour requires moderate physical activity. You should be in good health, able to stand for long periods of time, climb stairs and hills; and walk reasonable distances, walking up to three hours per day, possibly over uneven ground and cobblestone streets. Travelers should be healthy enough to participate in all included walks without assistance. Adding optional excursions may increase the total amount of walking on your tour. You should feel comfortable managing your own baggage at all times. If you have any mobility concerns or physical restrictions, please contact our OLLI office for additional information.

Travel Requirements:

We currently require proof of vaccination, & masks may be required for multiple day travel with SVSU-OLLI. We will provide any known updates closer to departure dates. Please call the OLLI office with any questions (989)964-4475.

Lodging

We will stay in accommodations handpicked to ensure quality and comfort. Specific hotel details will be given at the pre-trip dinner.

Travel Protection:*

Go Ahead's trip protection will be included in the price of this trip and must be paid at the time of deposit upon registration. The "Trip protection" package has pre-existing condition coverage. Day 1: Tuesday, September 17

Depart SVSU via motorcoach for our flight from Detroit to Halifax, Nova Scotia. **Welcome to Canada!** Transfer to your hotel and get settled in.

<u>Day 2: Wednesday, September 18</u> (*Halifax, N.S.*) Sightseeing Tour of Halifax

Join a kilted local guide and head out on a sightseeing tour of Halifax, a global city serving as Nova Scotia's capital. We will set off on foot to explore the Fairview Lawn Cemetery, where many Titanic victims are buried. Next stop is at the Victorian-era Halifax Public Gardens. Enjoy a guided visit to the Canadian Museum of Immigration at Pier 21, which pays homage to the many immigrants who have shaped Canada's history. After the Canadian Museum, we will have time to stroll along the city's large natural harbor. We will gather with our Tour Director for a welcome lunch as a group. The afternoon and evening are yours to explore. (B,L)

<u>Day 3: Thursday, September 19</u> (*Moncton, N.B.*) Moncton via Peggy's Cove & Lunenburg

Following breakfast, we will travel to Moncton, for one night stay. Moncton is a significant crossroads center of the Maritime provinces, making stops en route. Enjoy time to admire stunning coastal scenery at Peggy's Cove, a rural coastal region in Nova Scotia. Next will be a visit to the UNESCO-listed port town of Lunenburg. The evening is yours to do as you wish. Take advantage of your free time to explore the charming port town. (B)

<u>Day 4: Friday, September 20</u> (*Charlottetown, P.E.I.*) Charlottetown via Hopewell Rocks

The day will begin with travel to Charlottetown, P.E.I, where we will spend the next two nights. Planned is a guided tour of the intriguing rock formations, Hopewell Rocks, located in the Bay of Fundy. Enjoy time to marvel at the power of tidal erosion as you explore Hopewell Rocks Provincial Park. We will have marvelous views of beaches and covered bridges during a photo stop at Mary's Point, a sanctuary for shorebird species and home to internationally recognized wetlands. Take advantage of the free time to explore the Bay of Fundy, a natural wonder that boasts the most significant tidal change in the world, and walk on the ocean floor during low tide. Later, we will cross the Confederation Bridge to Prince Edward Island. Marvel at this feat of engineering, which crosses the Abegweit Passage and is the longest bridge to span ice-covered water. Then we will make our way to Charlottetown, the capital of Prince Edward Island and home to various historic buildings. This evening we will attend an authentic Acadian cultural show and listen to traditional music as you enjoy an included dinner during the interactive experience. (B, D)

<u>Day 5: Saturday, September 21</u> (*Charlottetown, P.E.I.*) Kensington & Cavendish Beach

Today we will get to know some of Prince Edward Island's charming sights on a guided tour. The day will begin with a short trip to Kensington, the Heart of P.E.I. The first stop will be visiting the Anne of Green Gables Museum, located on Campbell Farm. We will have time to explore the property, which inspired L.M. Montgomery's famous novel. Next will be a transfer to Cavendish Beach, which runs almost five miles along the Gulf of Saint Lawrence. Take time to marvel at the red dunes and have a chance to breathe fresh sea air as we stroll along the boardwalks. Dinner will be on your own this evening. (B)

<u>Day 6: Sunday, September 22</u> (Cape Breton Region, N.S.) Transfer to Cape Breton Island

Begin by heading back to Nova Scotia, to Cape Breton Island. En route, we will briefly visit the Wood Islands, a fishing area on P.E.I. Then, board a ferry to Pictou County, N.S. Disembark from the ferry in Caribou, a rural area on the Northumberland Strait. We will stop in the coastal town of Pictou, which was the first place Scottish immigrants landed in the late 1700s. Next will be the transfer to the village of Baddeck, located along the shore of the Bras d'Or Lake on Cape Breton Island and noted as the starting and ending point of the Cabot Trail. Here we will visit the Alexander Graham Bell National Historic Site, which pays homage to the life and work of the famous inventor. An included dinner in Baddeck for this evening. (B, D)

<u>Day 7: Monday, September 23</u> (Cape Breton Region, N.S.)

Sightseeing tour of Cape Breton Highlands National Park

The day begins with a sightseeing tour of Cape Breton Highlands National Park. We will start by driving to Cheticamp, a fishing town on the Cabot Trail, and enjoy an included lunch. Take in the breathtaking views of oceans and mountains as you journey north along the Cabot Trail through Cape Breton Highlands National Park. As we drive through the park, we will make scenic photo stops at Neil's Harbour and Ingonish Beach. (B,L)

<u>Day 8: Tuesday, September 24</u> (Halfax Region, N.S.) Halifax Region via the Grand-Pré National Historic Site

After breakfast we'll begin our drive back to mainland Nova Scotia, making several stops along the way including a visit to the Sugar Moon Farm and learn about producing maple products, and enjoy a tasing of the iconic Canadian treat, sugar-on-snow. We'll also enter the UNESCO-listed Grand-Pré National Historic Site to learn about Acadian history. Enjoy the beautiful coastal scenery as you continue to the Halifax region. We will celebrate the trip with your fellow travelers at a farewell dinner. (B,D)



<u>Day 9: Wednesday, September 25</u> Departure

Today, we will transfer to the airport for your flight home. Breakfast will be included unless we have an early morning flight. (B)

<u>OR</u> continue on your adventure with an extension to St. John's Newfoundland. St. John's is one of the oldest cities in North America, but this scenic port city still boasts a decidedly modern vibe. After a short flight, set out on a sightseeing tour to discover this delightfully distinct Canadian capital.

Optional 3 - Day Extension: St. John's, Newfoundland and Labrador

<u>Day 9: Wednesday, September 25</u> (St. John's, N.L.) Flight to St. John's

Today we will board a plane as fly to St. John's, Newfoundland, which is the capital of the province of Newfoundland and Labrador. (B)

<u>Day 10: Thursday, September 26</u> (St. John's, N.L.) Sightseeing Tour of St. John's

We start the day on a panoramic bus tour of St. John's, passing through the Government House and the mid-19th-century Basilica of St. John the Baptist. Take in the stunning views of the city during a photo stop at Signal Hill, which is surrounded by 17th-century fortifications and is the site of the Cabot Tour. Then we will transfer to Cape Spear, the most easterly point in North America, and walk along a stunning cliffside trail to the Cape Spear Lighthouse. Stroll the streets of the charming Quidi Vidi Village, a historic fishing town along Newfoundland and Labrador's northeastern coast. Pay a visit to the Plantation Craft Studios, where you can watch local artisans create various handmade items, from pottery to woodcut prints, and take some trinkets home for yourself. Continue to The Rooms museum and enjoy free time to explore the exhibits that highlight the region's history, culture, artwork, and wildlife. Then, sit down at a local restaurant for an included dinner served with beer or wine. (B,D)

<u>Day 11: Friday, September 27</u> (St. John's, N.L.) Free Day in St. John's

Today the day is yours to explore St. John's. This evening, we will gather as a group and enjoy a farewell drink as we celebrate the trip and extension that we went on together. (B)

Day 12: Saturday, September 28

Departure

Today, we will transfer to the airport for your flight home. Breakfast will be included unless we have an early morning flight. (B)

I (or parent or legal guardian if enrollee is under 18 or a minor under any other applicable law) am an enrollee on an EF Go Ahead Tour and understand and agree to the following:

- 1. I acknowledge and understand that my tour is operated by EF Education First International Ltd., Switzerland, and that Go Ahead Vacations, Inc. acts only as a marketing service provider for that company. Go Ahead Vacations, Inc. does not provide any goods or services for your trip. If I am participating in a domestic tour in the U.S., I understand that a portion of my tour may be operated by EF Explore America, Inc., a U.S. affiliate.
- 2. EF Education First International Ltd., Go Ahead Vacations, Inc., and (if applicable) EF Explore America, Inc., and their affiliated companies, partners, and any companies acting on their behalf, along with their officers, directors, employees, agents, and authorized representatives (collectively referred herein as "GAT") do not own or operate any entity which is to or does provide goods or services for my tour, including for example hotels; arrangements for, ownership of, or control over houses, apartments, or other lodging facilities; tour directors; airline, vessel, bus, or other transportation companies; local ground operators; visa processing services; providers or organizers of optional excursions; or food service or entertainment providers. I acknowledge that all such persons and entities, specifically the Tour Director assigned to my tour, are independent contractors and not employees or agents of GAT. As a result, GAT is not liable for any negligent or willful act or failure to act of any such person or entity, or of any other third party.
- 3. Without limitation, GAT is not responsible for any injury, loss, or damage to person or property, death, disease, sickness, delay or inconvenience in connection with the provision of any goods or services occasioned by or resulting from any event or cause beyond the direct control of GAT or as a result of any negligent or willful act or failure to act of any third party. I hereby unconditionally and unequivocally waive any and all claims and demands for all damages, losses, costs and expenses of any nature whatsoever (including attorney's fees) on account of or arising out of any and all personal injury, death, bodily injury, mental anguish, emotional distress, property or other damage that I may suffer from any cause whatsoever related in any way to my participation in any GAT-sponsored tour. I further agree to release and hold harmless the Released Parties from any and all decisions to cancel, modify or delay the tour as a result of events that are beyond the reasonable control of GAT including such "acts of God" or force majeure events as actual or threats of: epidemics or pandemics, or other public health issues or emergencies (such as but not limited to the current COVID-19 pandemic); severe weather events or natural disasters such as but not limited to hurricanes, earthquakes, tsunamis, tornadoes, fires, floods, volcanic activity, or landslides; war (whether declared or undeclared); terrorist activities; instability in a destination location; incidents of violence, riot, sabotage, civil commotion, or nationalization; strikes or labor disputes or lockouts; government orders, sanctions, actual or potential quarantines, or other restrictions affecting travel in, to, or around a location; disruption to transportation; chemical or radioactive contamination; or any other reason that makes it actually or potentially impossible or illegal for GAT to conduct the tour as originally contracted.
- 5. I understand that travel can involve inconvenience and risk, including, but not limited to, sickness, diseases, forces of nature, geographic and climatic conditions, different hygienic standards, infrastructure problems (including road maintenance, transportation delays and accommodation condition), civil unrest, vandalism, crime, political instability and terrorism. Medical services or facilities may not be readily available or available at all during all or a portion of the tour and, if available, may not be equal to standards in my home location or home country. I further understand that travel in other nations is not similar to travel in the United States and that different parts of the world present unique health, disease, and safety concerns, and I agree to review any specific risks related to my destination by visiting the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's Traveler's Health website at www.cdc.gov/travel and the State Department's International Travel website at www.state.gov/travel. I assume all risk of bodily injury, death, emotional trauma, property damage, inconvenience and/or loss resulting from negligence or any other acts of any and all persons or entities, however caused, including, but not limited to, those risks mentioned above. It is my intention fully to assume all of the risks of travel and participation in the program and to GAT from any and all liabilities to the maximum extent permitted by law.
- **6.** I agree that the releases of liability included herein apply to and bind myself and any minor child who I am enrolling as a parent/legal guardian, along with all personal representatives, executors, heirs, and family.
- 7. GAT shall have no responsibility for me whatsoever when I am absent from GAT supervised activities or for non-supervised activities.
- **8.** My tour begins with the takeoff from the GAT departure airport and ends upon completion of the flight back to the origination (or other arrival) airport. If I have purchased my own flights, I understand that my tour begins with my arrival at the first accommodation or transfer arranged by GAT on my itinerary and ends with my departure from the final accommodation arranged by GAT on my itinerary and does not include flights between cities.

- 9. The air carrier's liability for loss of or damage to baggage or property, or for death or injury to person, is subject to and limited by the airline's contract of carriage, its tariff, the Montreal Convention or Warsaw Convention and their amendments or both.
- 10. I understand and agree that GAT reserves the right to refuse or cancel my reservation at their sole discretion. In such event, standard cancellation guidelines as outlined in the Booking Conditions apply.

I understand and agree that GAT may dismiss me from the tour at any time and at my sole expense for the failure to follow such rules or directions or for any other reason that GAT deems in its sole discretion requires my dismissal from the tour. I understand that in the event I am dismissed from the tour for any reason, I waive the right to a refund of any part of my program price, and that GAT may then send me home at my own expense. GAT is not responsible for arranging my transport home.
- 12. I agree to abide by all local laws, regulations, and governmental advisories when traveling, including but not limited to all local health requirements. I understand that if I disobey, refuse to follow, or abuse such laws, regulations and governmental advisories, even unintentionally, I waive my right to a refund of any part of the program price, and GAT may send me home at my own expense. I also understand that should local authorities be involved, I will be subject to the laws of the country I am visiting.
- 13. I understand and agree that if I become ill or incapacitated, GAT and its employees or contractors may take any action they deem necessary for my safety and well-being, including securing medical treatment and transporting me home at my own expense. GAT retains the right and has my authorization, in its sole discretion, to contact my emergency contact(s) with regard to health issues or any matter whatsoever that relates to my tour. In the event of a medical emergency, GAT will attempt to cause appropriate treatment to be administered, and I authorize GAT to do so. GAT, however, makes no warranty that it will be able to cause effective (or any) emergency treatment to be administered and GAT will not be responsible for monitoring any health care that I may necessitate.
- 14. I understand and agree that GAT has the right to make changes in tour itineraries and departure dates, and to modify transportation arrangements, including the use of substitute airlines. In the event of such changes, refunds will be given only in accordance with the provisions of the Booking Conditions supplied herewith.
- 15. I understand that it is my responsibility to secure the necessary travel documents (e.g., passport, visa[s], vaccination records, or other required medical records for all locations on my tour (including locations visited during transit). Failure to do so does not constitute grounds for a refund except according to the refund and cancellation guidelines as outlined in the Booking Conditions.
- 16. GAT is not responsible for loss of passports, airline tickets, or other documents, or for loss of or damage to luggage or any other passenger belongings. In the case of a lost paper airline ticket or missing a flight booked by GAT, I acknowledge that I am solely responsible for meeting the airline's requirements (both logistical and financial) for ticket replacement.
- 17. I understand that I will be required to pay for any phone calls or incidental personal expenses that I incur at hotels, as well as for any damage I cause to hotel rooms, buses or other property.
- **18.** I represent that I understand the pacing, content, accommodations, and other aspects of the tour upon which I have enrolled, and that I have discussed with GAT any limitations that may make it difficult or impossible for me to participate in this tour as designed.
