#### (15) Navigating Shallow Waters: Maritime Museums Around the World

In today's fast-paced world, we forget that autos and airplanes have been part of the travel equation only for about 60 years. Before that, it was trains and ships. Prior to the 1840s — and going back millennia — the easiest way to move things was by boat. One fact that surprises people is that we remain a maritime-dependent society. Over 90 percent of the products that Americans consume have spent time on a ship. # (16) Smugglers on the Strait: 300 Years of Smuggling on Detroit's Waterways

Since the arrival of Europeans on the strait known as the Detroit River, smugglers have been actively profiting from contraband. The narrow river separating two countries offered the perfect opportunity, and the city's legacy of fast cars, fast boats and international border crossings provided the vehicles. Over time, this risky trade has included furs, liquor, books, drugs, even humans – and it continues to this day. Of particular interest are the Prohibition years, a period of new technologies, great music, economic upheaval, changing social mores, and the growth of organized crime. In southeast Michigan, with an exploding population of immigrants, migrants, and first-generation Americans – many of whom had a cultural affinity to alcohol – there was little support for Prohibition, and Canadian neighbors were particularly happy to provide what satisfied their thirst.






