This course examines the choices and constraints regarding sources and uses of energy by households, firms, and governments through a number of frameworks to describe and explain behavior at various levels of aggregation. Examples include a wide range of countries, scope, settings, and analytical approaches.

This course is one of many OCW Energy Courses, and it is a core subject in MIT's undergraduate Energy Studies Minor. This Institute-wide program complements the deep expertise obtained in any major with a broad understanding of the interlinked realms of science, technology, and social sciences as they relate to energy and associated environmental challenges.

## CHAIR'S NOTE



Hello OLLI friends,

My good news for this month continues news from a Washington Post article by its Editorial Board. The article reports some good things that happened in 2019. First, the residents of Hong Kong are demonstrating that hopes for democracy and the rule of law are alive and well. They have been protesting in droves for months and months and voted in record numbers to support pro-democracy candidates in local elections.

Second, in similarly inspiring fashion, women in Latin America and then world-wide rallied against anti-women violence. Young people in many countries demanded action on climate change, and young people in the United States kept up demands for progress on gun-law reform.

Third, people-power was demonstrated in Sudan when, after months of dangerous protesting against the murderous dictatorship of Oma Hassan al-Bashir, citizens won a commitment for a three-year transition leading to elections. Al-Bashir was sentenced to two years in prison for corruption.

These actions renew my faith that, in spite of all the news about offenses by authoritarian governments and what seems like omni-present corruption, there are large swaths of folks who fight for good.

We are excited to welcome Connie to the OLLI office, so give her a call to say hello!


## OLLI AT HOME


