



Director's Note



As a director I enjoy exploring unique production concepts for plays, like setting *A Doll House* as a 1950's sitcom, *Mamma Mia!* as dueling Greek vacation postcards, or *God of Carnage* as a Francis Bacon painting. It's a chance to honor the original text while adding in your own artistic flair: for designers to explore new choices, for actors to find deeper facets of the characters, and for audiences to enjoy a fresh take on a classic they love. For *Noises Off*, though, I found the opposite to be true. As the quotes above attest, *Noises* is mathematical, and adding even the smallest factor puts the equation out of balance. Act II in particular is a masterclass in physical storytelling: a 30 minute pantomime paired with a live performance on the other side of the set (the noises off-stage for which the play is named). Every line in Act I is foreshadowing for a bit in Act II which in turn is a punchline in Act III. As a director, it's not a challenge of reinterpretation, but in doing one's level best to honor every gag, look, and joke that's already jam-packed into Michael Frayn's meticulously brilliant farce within a play within a farce.


We took on this incredibly challenge back in November, and I am thrilled to be a part of such a dedicated team of artists bringing it to life. The student designers, technicians, and actors in particular have gone above and beyond to make *Noises Off* shine, and I couldn't be prouder.

Noises Off is a love letter to the theatre, but also a challenge. It's thrilling and frustrating, hysterical and painstaking. I believe our students have more than risen to the challenge, and we are so excited to share it with you tonight. We think Frayn's math is hilarious, and we hope you do too.

Props Designer:




