

This transfer credit guide provides important information for Mott Community College students who expect to pursue a bachelor's degree at SVSU. Students who also expect to pursue an associate degree at Mott should consult directly with a Mott academic adviser about the associate degree.

This information is subject to change without notice. Individual circumstances, degree paths, and credit totals will vary by student. Students are responsible for maintaining regular contact with an SVSU transfer adviser.

NOTES:

¹ This is only a guide; the [SVSU catalog](#) is the official document governing program and degree requirements and transfer policies.

² SVSU accepts a maximum of 62 applicable community college transfer credits toward the minimum 120 credit bachelor degree requirement. Students should count credits and limit their choices accordingly.

³ Bachelor degree candidates must meet SVSU Basic Skills and General Education (BS/GE) requirements. In addition to this academic major guide, refer to and cross reference the supplemental [Basic Skills and General Education guide](#) for appropriate electives.

⁴ Two Communication Intensive (CI) courses (3 credits each) are required for the SVSU bachelor degree. See an SVSU transfer adviser.

⁵ Michigan Transfer Agreement (MTA) students must complete CI courses at SVSU. Contact an SVSU transfer adviser for additional guidance on this and on other transfer topics.

⁶ A pre-requisite course is required for any SVSU course that is listed in bold. Depending upon student course placement, some prerequisite courses may be waived. See an SVSU transfer adviser.

⁷ Some majors require a minor. Additional credit options — possibly within GE — may be appropriate. Contact an SVSU transfer adviser for details.

⁸ Additional credits, if any, vary by major/minor combination, upper level, transfer-from school, etc. Choice of major/minor combination and of electives can be pertinent to various residency and degree requirements.

The RN-BSN program is for students who already have (or who will have) a valid Michigan RN licensure at the associate degree level by the time they begin taking NURS coursework from SVSU to advance their education to a Bachelor of Science in Nursing/BSN.

*Articulation students in the RN-BSN program will earn their validated articulation credits via the successful completion of NURS 301, which is taken as the first course in the core nursing courses. Articulation credits may total as many as 39, but in no case shall the combined total of articulation credits and transfer credits exceed 93 credits overall.

**Be certain to reserve at least 30 credits for completion at SVSU to satisfy SVSU's baccalaureate degree residency requirement. For example, the 15 NURS credits noted above, the 9 upper-level credits of Required Elective Courses for the RN-BSN program (see svsu.edu/catalog and the Program Coordinator), and at least 6 credits of GE or other coursework can help satisfy the minimum 30 credit residency.
